

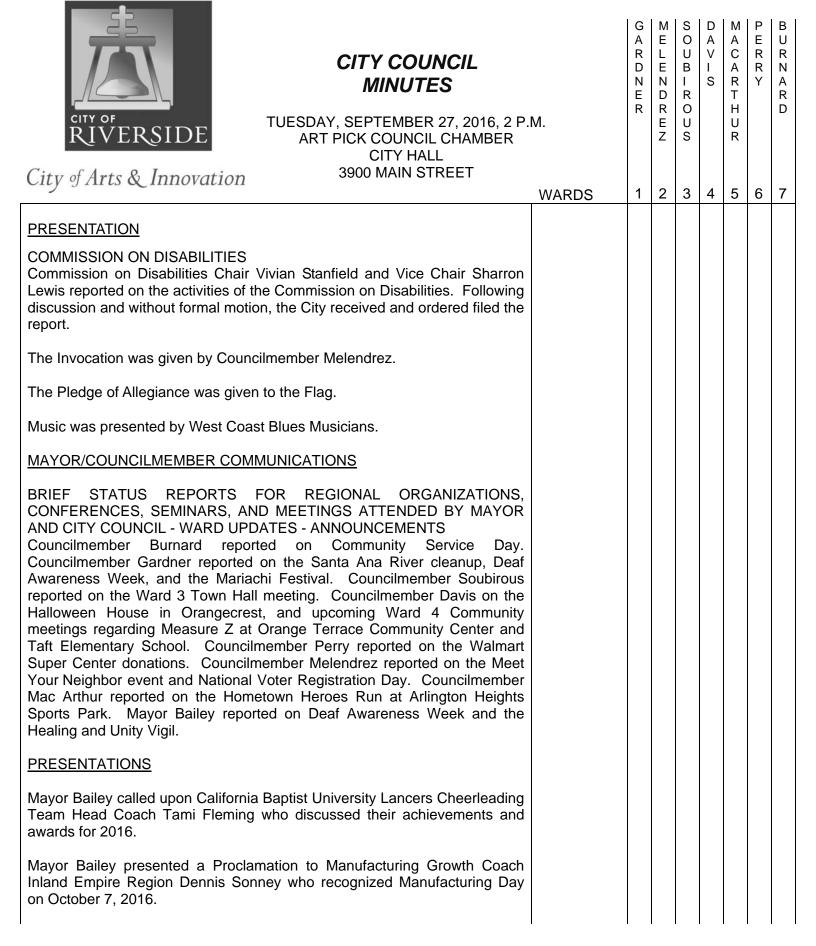

PUBLIC HEARINGS/PLANNING REFERRALS AND APPEALS MOBILE HOME PARKS RENT STABILIZATION Hearing was called on mobile home parks rent stabilization pursuant to Section 5.75.080 of the Riverside Municipal Code relative to activities associated with the Mobile Home Parks Rent Stabilization Ordinance over the preceding 12-month period from September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016. Two people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council (1) directed staff to notify mobile home park owners and tenant representatives on record of the maximum allowable rent increase that will be in effect in calendar year 2017 according to Section 5.75.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code, upon receipt of the appropriate Consumer Price Index data for August 2016; and (2) received and ordered filed the report on all activities that have taken Х Motion place relative to the Mobile Home Parks Rent Stabilization Ordinance for the Second Х 2015 reporting from September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016. 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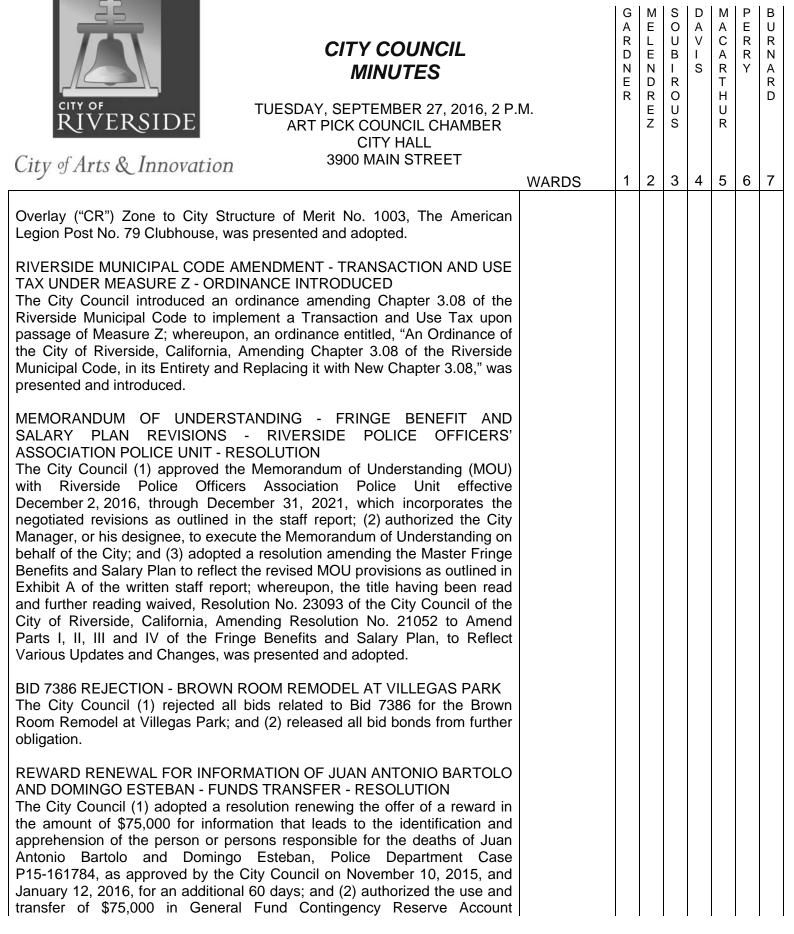
