# TRAFFIC CIRCULATION PILOT PROJECT - PEARBLOSSOM AND SYCAMORE CANYON

The City Council approved the City Council Transportation Committee recommendation for the 4-month traffic circulation pilot project to prohibit ingress on Pearblossom Drive and Sycamore Canyon Boulevard at El Cerrito Drive for the test period from September 22, 2016, through January 22, 2017.

# PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT - SYCAMORE CANYON WILDERNESS PARK

The City Council (1) approved the Purchase and Sale Agreement with COEG-CA-2, LLC, for the appraised value of \$450,000 from State of California, Department of Parks and Recreation Habitat Conservation funds and Regional Park Special Capital Improvement or future State or Federal grant funds for purchase of a 5-acre parcel of vacant land located at Via Vista and Canyon Crest Drives, identified as Assessor Parcel Number 252-230-004, to be incorporated into the adjacent Sycamore Canyon Wilderness Park; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction, and to expend up to \$7,500 for due diligence, title and escrow fees, and related miscellaneous closing costs.

# 2016 EDITION CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS TITLE 24 - CALIFORNIA BUILDING STANDARDS CODE AMENDMENTS - RESOLUTION - ORDINANCES INTRODUCED

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution making the necessary express findings as required by State law to support local amendments to the 2016 edition of California Code of Regulations Title 24, the California Building Standards Code; and (2) introduced ordinances adopting the 2016 edition of California Code of Regulations Title 24, the California Building Standards Code with local amendments thereto; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23108 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Making its Express Findings as Required by

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Section 17958.7 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California Relating to the Adoption of the 2016 Edition of the California Building Code and the 2016 Editions of the California Residential, Green Building Standards, Mechanical, Plumbing, Fire, and Electrical Codes with Local Amendments Thereto, was presented and adopted; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Title 16 of the Riverside Municipal Code, Chapters 16.04, 16.06, 16.07, 16.08, 16.11, 16.12, and 16.16 to Adopt the 2016 Editions of the California Building, Residential, Green Building Standards, Mechanical, Plumbing, and Electrical Codes with Local Amendment Thereto;" and "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Title 16 of the Riverside Municipal Code, Chapter 16.32 to Adopt the 2016 Edition of the California Fire Code with Local Amendment Thereto," were presented and introduced.

### BID 7429 - MOTOR FUEL FOR CITY FIRE STATIONS

The City Council (1) awarded Bid 7429 to Flyers Energy of Bloomington and Desert Pacific Oil, LLC, Riverside, in the amount of \$100,000, from the Fire Operations-Motor Fuels and Lubricants Account to provide fuel to City Fire Stations through June 30, 2017, with two additional one-year extension options through November 1, 2019; and (2) authorized the Purchasing Services Manager to issue purchase orders as outlined in Bid 7429, subject to availability of funds.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF ELECTRICAL WORKERS - UTILITY AND SUPERVISORY UNITS - SALARY SURVEY ADJUSTMENT - CONTINUED The City Council continued the 2016 International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Benchmark Salary Survey Adjustment.

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
