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

2016 TAXABLE PENSION OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS RESOLUTION

Hearing was called to consider a resolution authorizing the issuance of a not-to-exceed \$34.5 million aggregate principal Taxable Pension Obligation Refunding Bonds 2017 Series A (the "POB") with an average interest rate not-to-exceed up to 5.5 percent, to refund the bond anticipation note issued in 2016 and maturing on June 1, 2017, representing the Series B variable rate portion of the outstanding debt originally issued in 2005 to fund a portion of the City's pension obligation with the California Public Employees Retirement Systems and approve the financing team with Stifel, Nicolaus and Company, Inc., as underwriting bank, Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth as bond counsel, Jones Hall as disclosure counsel, and Urban Futures, Inc., as financial advisor. Two people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council (1) adopted the resolution authorizing execution and delivery of the notes authorizing issuance of not-to-exceed \$34.5 million aggregate principal Taxable Pension Obligation Refunding Bonds with an average interest rate not-to-exceed 5.5 percent; (2) approved the financing team with Stifel, Nicolaus and Company, Inc., as underwriting bank, Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth as bond counsel, Jones Hall as disclosure counsel, and Urban Futures, Inc.; (3) approved issuance of bonds after the City Council meeting of May 16, 2017, and consideration of Budget Engagement Commission recommendations; and (4) directed staff to make any and all necessary modifications to the Eleventh Supplemental Indenture, the Preliminary Official Statement, the Bond Purchase Agreement, and the Continuing Disclosure Agreement to effectuate a 10-year bond; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23170 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California Authorizing the Issuance of City of Riverside Taxable Pension Obligation Refunding Bonds, 2017

SPEED LIMIT ZONES - BARTON/WELLS - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED The City Council introduced and subsequently adopted an ordinance to (1) establish a 45 MPH speed limit zone on Barton Street from Van Buren Boulevard to Mariposa Avenue; and (2) reduce the existing speed limit on Wells Avenue from Tyler Street to Hole Avenue from 40 MPH to 35 MPH; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California Amending Section 10.76.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code Designating the Prima Facie Speed Limits for Streets and Portions Thereof in Accordance with the Provisions of Sections 10.20.020 and 10.20.030," was presented and introduced.
