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

MISCELLANEOUS PLANNING AND ZONING ITEMS BUDGET ENGAGEMENT COMMISSION Ted White, City Planner, stated that the Budget Engagement Committee has requested that all Boards and Commissions recommend three to five priorities for Measure Z consideration, as well as appoint a representative to address the Committee on April 6, 2017. Mr. White indicated that staff has provided the Commission with three recommendations. Staff is asking that the Commission also consider supporting the Cultural Heritage Board's recommendation for the Citywide Engagement Strategy funding. Following discussion the Planning Commission recommended to support the Planning Division's recommendations: 1) \$4.5 million (\$1.5 million/year for three years) to prepare a comprehensive update to the City's General Plan, Specific Plans and Zoning Code, and to rezone properties to be consistent with the General Plan; 2) \$300,000 to facilitate GIS Data Migration and Public Portal development; 3) \$300,000 for a one-time Planning records management effort to organize, scan, and		1 X	2	3 X	4 X	5 X		7 X	W 3	W	
one-time Planning records management effort to organize, scan, and convert hard copy Planning records to a digital format and make them available on-line to the public; and 4) to support the Cultural Heritage Board's identified priority to provide \$100,000 to prepare a Citywide Community Engagement Strategy. The Commission also added: 5) \$20,000 for the purpose of Planning Commissioner training and development opportunities. Commissioners Parker and Rossouw volunteered to attend the April 6, 2017 meeting and present to the Budget Engagement Committee.
