
Chair Parker called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all members present except commissioner Mill.

PLANNING/ZONING MATTERS FROM THE AUDIENCE There were no oral comments at this time.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

<u>PLANNING CASES P16-0321, P16-0324 and P17-0196</u> – Conditional Use Permit and Design Review – 3777 Mission Inn Avenue (Ward 1) Proposal by Mark Rubin of Regional Properties, Inc. to consider a Conditional Use Permit to permit the construction of a mixed-use development with a density greater than 60 dwelling units per acre, a Floor Area Ratio greater than 4.0 and a building height greater than 60 feet and Variances to allow fewer parking stalls than required by Code and a rear yard setback less than required by Code. Brian Norton, Senior Planner, presented the staff report. Mark Rubin, Regional Properties, Inc. stated they were in agreement with staff's recommendations except condition 32 and 33. He deferred to his architect for further comment. Comments from the audience: Dave Leonard, Director Old Riverside Foundation, and Chani Beeman, Downtown Neighborhood Alliance, spoke in support. Richard Drumwoody, architect, requested a change to conditions 32 and 33. Staff is recommending replacement of the existing palm trees within the right-of-way with Chinese Flame Trees and Ginkgo Biloba trees. Due to maintenance and visibility issues for the lower level commercial businesses, the applicant would prefer palm trees and would agree to retain the mature palms and/or replace them with uniform height California Fan Palms along Mission Inn Avenue, and uniform height Queen Palms along Sixth Street. Jeff Hart, Engineering Manager, stated they would be happy to work with the applicant. Following discussion the Planning Commission: 1) Determined that the project is consistent with Motion the previously-certified Fox Plaza Environmental Impact Report; and 2) Second Χ Approved Planning Cases P16-0321 (Conditional Use Permit), P16-0324 All Ayes Χ Χ Χ Χ Χ Χ (Variance) and P17-0196 (Variance) based on the findings in the staff report and subject to the recommended conditions. With Modification to conditions 32 and 33. 32) On Mission Inn Avenue, plant 24" Box Size California Palms or alternative species mutually agreed upon by applicant and staff. 33) On Sixth Street, plant 24" Box Size California Palms or alternative mutually agreed upon by applicant and staff.

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
