INTER-AGENCY INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES TRAINING REIMBURSEMENT FUNDS - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION
The City Council (1) accepted training reimbursement funds from Rancho Santiago Community College District in the amount of \$17,743.33; and (2) approved an increase in revenues in the amount of \$17,743.33 in

PUBLIC SAFETY REALIGNMENT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) approved the Riverside County Probation Department and Post-Release Accountability and Compliance Team for Public Safety Realignment Memorandum of Understanding; (2) accepted Riverside County Probation Department funds in the amount of \$215,000 for reimbursement of City personnel costs related to the Post-Release Accountability and Compliance Team; (3) accepted State funds, through the City of Corona, in the amount of \$265,000 for personnel costs related to the Post-Release Accountability and Compliance Team; (4) authorized a supplemental appropriation of revenue in the amount of \$480,000 to be offset by expenditures in the same amount to an account as established by the Finance Department for personnel costs related to the Post-Release Accountability and Compliance Team; and (5) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all the necessary documents including making minor non-substantive changes to those documents.

2017-18 ARTS AND CULTURE GRANTS PROGRAM - AD HOC COMMITTEE FORMATION Following discussion, the City Council approved the City Council Finance Committee recommendations to (1) approve staff to administer the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Arts and Culture Grant program; (2) authorize the same Arts and Culture Grant recipients and dollar amounts from Fiscal Year 2016-17 to be duplicated for Fiscal Year 2017-18, for a total amount of \$280,000; (3) approve the formation of an ad hoc committee to update the Arts and Culture Grant program and return to the City Council within six to nine months with recommendations; and (4) appoint the individuals to the City Council citizen ad hoc committee to update the Arts and Culture Brogram as recommended by staff adding seats for Alvord Unified School District, California Baptist University, Charter Schools, and California School for the Deaf Riverside. Councilmember Davis returned to the dais at this time.
