PUBLIC HEARINGS/PLANNING REFERRALS AND APPEALS

2016 TRANSPORTATION UNIFORM MITIGATION FEE (TUMF) NEXUS STUDY - ORDINANCE INTRODUCTION - RESOLUTION Hearing was called to consider the proposal of the City of Riverside to amend Chapter 16.68 of the Riverside Municipal Code relating to the Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee (TUMF) to conform to the 2016 TUMF Nexus Study Update adopted by Western Regional Council of Governments (WRCOG) and to adopt a resolution revising the fee schedule for the TUMF Program. 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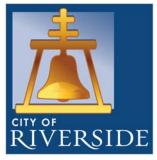

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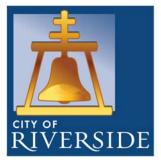
