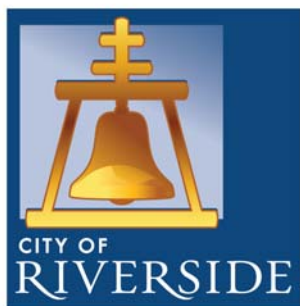

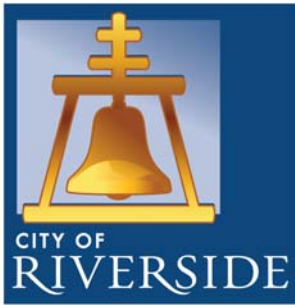


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<p>CASE P17-0478 - REZONING - 4838 ARLINGTON - ORDINANCE ADOPTED</p> <p>The City Council adopted an ordinance amending the Zoning Map of the City of Riverside pursuant to Chapter 19.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code by rezoning property for an office with a nine-space parking lot located on a .27-acre parcel located at 4838 Arlington Avenue from Single Family Residential (R-1-7000) to Office and Building Overlay (O-S-1); whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7415 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending the Zoning Map of the City of Riverside Pursuant to Chapter 19.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Rezoning Property Located at 4838 Arlington Avenue from Single Family Residential (R-1-7000) to Office and Building Overlay (O-S-1), was presented and adopted.</p> <p>CASE P18-0008 - REZONING - VAN BUREN/LINCOLN/RUDICILL - ORDINANCE ADOPTED</p> <p>The City Council adopted an ordinance amending the Zoning Map of the City of Riverside pursuant to Chapter 19.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code by rezoning land from Single Family Residential (R-1-7000) to Multiple Family Residential (R-4) located at the west side of Van Buren Boulevard between Lincoln Avenue and Rudicill Street; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7416 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending the Zoning Map of the City of Riverside Pursuant to Chapter 19.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Rezoning Land from Single Family Residential (R-1-7000) to Multiple Family Residential (R-4), was presented and adopted.</p> <p>LEASE AGREEMENT - INSTALLATION OF CANON COPIERS/PRINTERS AT VARIOUS LIBRARIES - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION</p> <p>The City Council (1) approved a lease agreement with Canon Solutions for the installation, usage, and maintenance of seven Canon copiers/printers at various library locations for a sixty-month term at an annual cost of \$36,104.34, totaling \$180,520 over the entire lease term; (2) authorized the Purchasing Manager to procure the seven Canon copiers at the agreement pricing from a "follow-on" contract to an existing competitively bid contract from DuPage County, Illinois, per Purchasing Resolution Section 702(g); (3) authorized a supplemental appropriation from Library Receipts-Printing Account 0000101-343839 to Library Equipment Maint/Repair Account 513000-424220; and (4) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute necessary documents for the Lease Agreement with Canon Solutions.</p>							

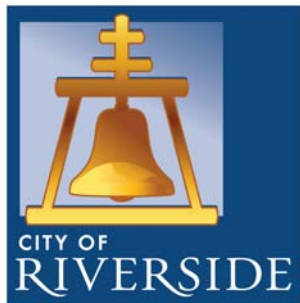


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<p>FOUR-CAMERA AUTOMATED LICENSE PLATE READER SYSTEM AND LICENSE - POLICE DEPARTMENT The City Council approved purchase of a Vigilant Solutions four-camera automated license plate reader system and license from Lehr Auto Electric in the amount of \$73,320.95 from Police Asset Forfeiture and State COPS Accounts.</p> <p><u>DISCUSSION CALENDAR</u></p> <p>POLICE DEPARTMENT ASSET FORFEITURE BUDGET - FUNDS TRANSFER - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION Following discussion, the City Council (1) authorized a supplemental appropriation of \$404,997 from Federal Asset Forfeiture Account 0000721-225111, \$159,300 from Federal Treasury Asset Forfeiture Account 0000721-225112, and \$148,500 from State Asset Forfeiture Account 0000721-225110, for a total amount of \$712,797; and (2) appropriated expenditures in the amount of \$712,797 to the Police Department expenditure accounts as outlined in the written staff report.</p> <p>POSSIBLE BREACH OF ATTORNEY/CLIENT PRIVILEGE AND VIOLATIONS RELATING TO MAYOR'S ATTEMPTED VETO OF CITY MANAGER CONTRACT - CONTINUED OFF CALENDAR The City Council continued off-calendar discussion of securing independent counsel for the purposing of investigating a possible breach of attorney/client privilege out of the Mayor's Office and possible violations relating to the Mayor's attempted veto of the City Manager's Employment Agreement on February 6, 2018.</p> <p>Mayor Bailey left during the following closed sessions.</p> <p><u>CLOSED SESSIONS</u></p> <p>The Mayor and City Council recessed to the City Council Board Room for closed sessions pursuant to Government Code (1) §54956.9(d)(1) to confer with and/or receive advice from legal counsel concerning City of Riverside v.
