

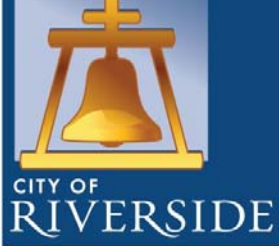



Certificate of Appropriateness requested by Russ Haley on behalf of CityMark Communities, LLC, for the construction of a multi-family development consisting of 13 residential units on a vacant lot within the Seventh Street Historic District. Scott Watson, Assistant Planner, presented the staff report. He indicated that an ecomment was received in opposition and a copy distributed to the Board this afternoon. <p>over materials and color and work with staff and the applicant to improve the design to be compatible with the historic district and thereby issuing a Certificate of Appropriateness.</p> <p>Chair Lech requested volunteers to serve on the subcommittee to work with staff and the applicant regarding project P17-0764.</p> <p>The volunteers were as follows: Chair Steve Lech, Board Member Nancy Parrish and Board Member Philip Falcone.</p> <p>Anthony Beaumon, Deputy City Attorney, announced that for the following case Jennifer Mermilliod will be acting as the applicant's consultant and Scott Watson will be the city staff presenting the proposal.</p> <p>PLANNING CASE P17-0899 – Certificate of Appropriateness – 4154 Twelfth Street, Ward 1</p> <p>Certificate of Appropriateness request by Nicholas Tavaglione of NL Tavaglione Consulting, for Teaman, Ramirez and Smith, Inc. to demolish an existing single family residence and construct a new parking lot on the eastern boundary of the Evergreen Quarter Historic District. Scott Watson, Assistant Planner, presented the staff report. He announced that an ecomment was received in opposition and a copy was distributed to the Board today. Nick Tavaglione, representing the applicant, stated he would be available for questions. There were no comments from the audience. Following discussion the Cultural Heritage Board recommended that the City Council: 1. Determine that Planning Case P17-0899 is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15303 (New Construction of Small Structures) and 15332 (In-fill development) of the CEQA Guidelines; and 2.
