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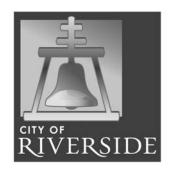

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AGREEMENT - THIRD STREET GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

Following discussion, the City Council (1) approved the agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments for \$4 million in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funding for the Third Street Grade Separation project; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments, including making minor non-substantial changes; and (3) authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$4 million in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funds to Third Street Grade Separation Project Account 9990119-440315 and increased the estimated revenue by the same amount into Third Street Grade Separation Project Account 9990119-339100.

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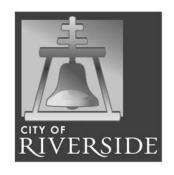

JOINT COMMUNITY FACILITIES AGREEMENT - TRACT MAP 33253 - 71-UNIT RESIDENTIAL PROJECT - ALAMO/RIVERA - RESOLUTION The City Council adopted a resolution approving a Joint Community Facilities Agreement between the City of Riverside, Riverside Unified School District, RSI Communities-California LLC, and Project Royal LP for financing of school and City facilities for Tract Map 33253 development of a 71-unit residential project located along the Santa Ana River at the intersection of Alamo and Rivera Streets; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23346 of the City Council of the City of Riverside Approving a Joint Community Facilities Agreement with Riverside Unified School District (Community Facilities District No. 34), was presented and adopted.

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Facilities District 2013-1 (Kunny Ranch) with MPLC Kunny Ranch, LLC; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreements with MPLC Kunny Ranch, LLC, including making minor and non-substantive changes; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23347 of the City Council of the City of Riverside Approving an Agreement Regarding the Payment of Development Fees for Certain Parcels to be Removed from Community Facilities District No. 2013-1 (Kunny Ranch), and Ordering the Recording of a Notice of Cancellation of the Special Tax Lien for Said Parcels, was presented and adopted.

AGREEMENT - RFP 1763 - GENERATOR MAINTENANCE SERVICES

The City Council (1) approved a Services Agreement, Request for Proposal 1763, with Collicutt Energy Services, Inc., Santa Fe Springs, in the amount of \$106,904.49 annually and authorized up to \$50,000 annually for additional on-call repair services as needed for an initial 24-month term through June 30, 2020, in the total amount of \$313,808.98 from Fiscal Year 2018-20 Fleet Fund (650) Sublet Repairs Account for generator maintenance services for the General Services Department Fleet Management Division; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Services Agreement including making any minor, non-substantive changes, and execute up to three additional one-year terms subject to the same terms and conditions of the original agreement.

MEASURE Z - PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT FOR POLICE PURSUIT VEHICLES

The City Council approved purchase and installation of various types of emergency equipment from Innovative Emergency Equipment, Riverside in the amount of \$106,173.50 from 2018-19 Measure Z Vehicle Replacement Account for ten police pursuit vehicles.

DONATION - RIVERSIDE PUBLIC LIBRARY FOUNDATION - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) authorized acceptance of a \$45,000 donation from Riverside Public Library Foundation for the Library Wish List for Wi-Fi printing, laptops for the Libraries Illuminated Project, and the innovation station project; and (2) authorized an appropriation of

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\$45,000 from Library Minor Gift Fund Account 0000722-225405 in the amounts of \$15,000 to Innovation Station Project State Operating Grant Account 9337000-440210; \$15,000 to Libraries Illuminated State Operating Grant Account 9336700-440210; and \$15,000 to Gift Funds Account 5145000-450201 with equal offsetting increases in revenues to Accounts 933700-334100, 9336700-334100, and 5145000-374222, in the amount of \$15,000 each for a total of \$45,000.

AGREEMENT RATIFICATION - LIBRARY ADVANCED NETWORK SERVICES - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) ratified the Agreement between Riverside Public Library and Califa for the Provision, Installation and Maintenance of Advanced Network (Data) Services as part of the Corporation for Education Network Initiatives in California's (CENIC) project, for a term from February 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017, with one-year automatic renewals each June 30 in the amount of \$164,746; (2) appropriated additional revenues in the amount of \$150,000 to Account 0000101-374200 (Miscellaneous Revenues) to account for the annual rebate credits through AT&T; (3) authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$150,000 from General Fund Balance Account 0000101-298000 to Account 5130000-421215 Internet Services; and (4) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement with Califa, including making minor and non-substantive changes and the contract extensions subject to availability of funding.

DEACCESSION OF AMERICAN INDIAN COLLECTION ITEMS

The City Council approved deaccession of American Indian collection items from six tribal or cultural organizations, in compliance with the Federal Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act.

U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE GRANT - STOP SCHOOL VIOLENCE THREAT AND ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION The City Council (1) authorized the Police Department to prepare and submit the Stop School Violence Threat Assessment grant application to the U.S. Department of Justice in the amount of \$250,000; (2) upon grant award, authorized an increase in estimated

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revenues in the amount of \$250,000 into Revenue Account 9163000-331100 and appropriated expenditures in the same amount into Police Department Account 916300-440110 by the Finance Department for the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to accept the grant assurances and certifications and make minor and non-substantive changes to documents associated with the grant application.

BIDS 7574, 7575, AND 7580 - RIVERSIDE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLANT CHEMICAL PURCHASES

The City Council approved (1) the following Riverside Water Quality Control Plant Chemical purchases for a total amount of \$2,873,468 from Public Works Chemical Supplies accounts: (a) Bid 7574 to Olin Corporation of Tracy in the amount of \$821,257 for purchase of 12.5 percent Sodium Hypochlorite; (b) Bid 7575 to Pacific Star Chemical of Sherwood, Oregon in the amount of \$144,900 for purchase of 50 percent Citric Acid; and (c) Bid 7580 to Univar USA, Inc., of Kent, Washington, in the amount of \$401,750 for purchase of 25 percent Sodium Bisulfite; (2) an annual purchase order for Ferric Chloride from Kemira Water Solutions Inc. Fontana, (under Section 602(g) of Purchasing Resolution 23256) in the amount of \$400,000; and (3) an annual purchase order for Polymer from Solenis LLC., of Wilmington, Delaware, (under Section 602(g) of Purchasing Resolution 23256) in the amount of \$1,105,561.

BID 7570 - RIVERSIDE REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLANT - BIO-SOLIDS IN-LINE SLUDGE SCREENS - 5950 ACORN

The City Council awarded Bid 7570 to Huber Technology, Inc., of Huntersville, North Carolina, in the amount of \$282,175 from the Sewer Fund Bio-Solids Handling Rehabilitation Account for purchase of two Bio-solids In-line Sludge Screens for the Riverside Regional Water Quality Control Plant located at 5950 Acorn Street.

LICENSE AGREEMENT - USE OF EXCESS RIGHT-OF-WAY DOOLITILE/VAN BUREN

The City Council (1) approved the License Agreement with Arthur Demirchyan and Narine Demirchyan for use of excess right-of-way on

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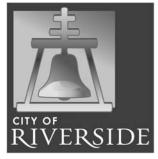
