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

AGREEMENT - REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS 1816 - CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE ASSESSMENTS AND DATA INPUT PROJECT The City Council (1) approved a Professional Services Agreement with Triad Consulting & System Design Group, LLC, for the UASI Critical Infrastructure Assessment and Data Input Project, in the amount of \$229,987 from Urban Area Security Initiative Funds to conduct 105 on-site threat-risk-vulnerability assessments for critical infrastructure locations and complete data input for Fiscal Years 2016 and 2017 grants with 30 assessments completed by March 30, 2019, and the remaining 75 assessments completed by March 30, 2020; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all documents pursuant to the Professional Consultant Services Agreement with Triad Consulting & System Design Group, LLC including making minor and non-substantive changes.

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
