

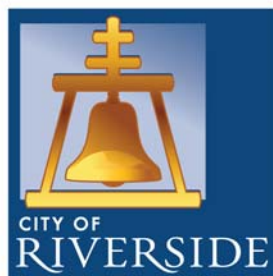

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - VAN BUREN BOULEVARD SEWER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT - WOOD/KING Following discussion, the City Council (1) approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, and Western Municipal Water District for construction of the Van Buren Sewer Improvements Project, which includes new public sewer facilities on Van Buren Boulevard between Wood Road and King Avenue to promote economic growth including installation of a gravity sewer within Van Buren Boulevard from Wood Road to King Avenue, construction of a new sewer lift station at Krameria Avenue and Washington Street, construction of a sewer force main to carry wastewater from the new pump station to Wood Road to join the existing gravity line, and abandonment and demolition of the MLK 1 sewer pump station; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, and Western Municipal Water District for construction of the Van Buren Sewer Improvements, including making minor and non-substantive changes; and (3) approved the Van Buren Sewer Improvement Project funding plan, which includes adjustments to the Sewer Fund capital improvement plan,

AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES PROGRAM
JOINT APPLICATION - MISSION HERITAGE PLAZA AND
SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS -
3901 AND 3933 MISSION INN AND 3942 SIXTH - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution authorizing submission of a joint application with Wakeland Housing and Development Corporation to the Department of Housing and Community Development for Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC) Program funding in a total amount not-to-exceed \$20,000,000 (\$14,000,000 for the AHSC Loan and \$6,000,000 for the AHSC Grant) for Mission Heritage Plaza and associated sustainable transportation infrastructure projects located at 3901 and 3933 Mission Inn Avenue and 3942 Sixth Street; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to sign any documents that may be required for submittal of the AHSC application, including making minor corrections as necessary; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23415 of the Council of the City of Riverside, California, Authorizing the Submission of a Joint Application to the Department of Housing and Community Development for the Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Program for Funding for the Mission Heritage Plaza and Associated Sustainable Transportation Improvement (STI) Projects, and Authorizing the Execution of all Required Documents by the City Manager or His Designee, was presented and adopted.

CASE P18-0606 - ZONING CODE AMENDMENT - WATER EFFICIENT
LANDSCAPE AND IRRIGATION - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an ordinance replacing Title 19 Chapter 19.570, Water Efficient Landscaping and Irrigation, in its entirety, to conform to State requirements for water efficient landscaping and re-establish the Water Efficient Landscape and Irrigation Ordinance provisions; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7454 of the City of Riverside, California, Replacing Title 19 Chapter 19.570, Water Efficient Landscaping and Irrigation, in its Entirety, was presented and adopted.



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CASE P18-0951 - HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND GRANT - HARADA
HOUSE REHABILITATION - 3356 LEMON

The City Council approved Planning Case P18-0951 awarding a \$10,800 Historic Preservation Fund Grant to hire a grant writing consultant to assist in writing a grant application for California Proposition 68 grant funding, subject to the Conditions of Approval, as outlined in the written staff report for rehabilitation of the Harada House located at 3356 Lemon Street.

RESOLUTION

The City Council adopted a resolution appointing Webb Municipal Finance, LLC (formerly known as Albert A. 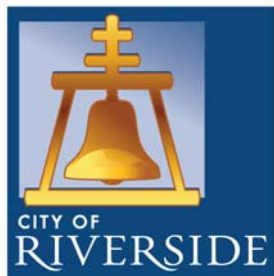

Webb Associates) as the Engineer of Record and ordering preparation of the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Engineer's Report to initiate the annual process of levying special assessments for Street Light Assessment District No. 1; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23418 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Initiating Proceedings to Levy and Collect Assessments for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the Street Lighting District No. 1 Pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, Appointing the Engineer of Record, and Ordering Preparation of an Engineer's Report, was presented and adopted.

LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN ANNEX - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution authorizing acceptance of the City of Riverside Local Hazard Mitigation Plan Annex from the Riverside County Operational Area Multi-Jurisdictional Local Hazard Mitigation Plan; and (2) authorized the City Manager or designee to execute related documents necessary to obtain federal financial assistance relating to mitigation; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23419 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Adopting the City of Riverside Local Hazard Mitigation Plan Annex from the Riverside County Operational Area Multi-Jurisdictional Local Hazard Mitigation Plan as Required by the Federal Disaster Mitigation and Cost Reduction Act of 2000, was presented and adopted.

MEASURE Z - UPGRADED ACCESS CONTROLLERS AND RELATED PERIPHERAL EQUIPMENT - CITY HALL AND PARKING STRUCTURE - 3900 MAIN

The City Council (1) approved purchase and installation of upgraded access controllers and related peripheral equipment with Stanley Security, Riverside, in the amount of \$88,309.12 for City Hall and the



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attached parking structure; and (2) authorized additional change order authority of up to 10 percent, for a total amount not-to-exceed \$97,140.03 for purchase and installation of upgraded access controllers and related peripheral equipment for City Hall and the attached parking structure.

MASTER FRINGE BENEFITS AND SALARY PLAN REVISIONS - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) approved adjustment to the salary range of the existing Building and Housing Inspection Supervisor classification; (2) approved adjustment to the salary range of the existing Senior Environmental Compliance Inspector classification; (3) approved adjustment to the salary level and change of bargaining unit designation of the existing City Traffic Engineer classification; (4) approved the title change for the Building and Housing Inspection Supervisor, Curator of Collections, Helicopter Mechanic series, and Mini-Bus Driver/Scheduler classifications; and (5) adopted a resolution amending the Master Fringe Benefits and Salary Plan to reflect the salary adjustments, bargaining unit designation change, and retitle of the Building and Housing Inspection Supervisor, Curator of Collections, and Helicopter Mechanic series, and Mini-Bus Driver/Scheduler classifications; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23420 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Resolution No. 21052 and the Master Fringe Benefits and Salary Plan to Adjust the Salary Ranges of the Existing Building and Housing Inspection Supervisor and Senior Environmental Compliance Inspector Classifications, to Adjust the Salary Level and Change of Bargaining Unit Designation to the Existing City Traffic Engineer Classification, to Change the Titles for the Building and Housing Inspection Supervisor, Curator of Collections, Helicopter Mechanic Series and Mini-Bus Driver/Scheduler Classifications, was presented and adopted.

MEASURE Z - AGREEMENT - MICROSOFT SOFTWARE PRODUCTS

The City Council (1) approved the Microsoft Enterprise Agreement with PCM-G, Inc., El Segundo, in response to Request for Quote PUARC-1518, in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,614,896.36 for Microsoft software products for a three-year term; (2) authorized staff to issue

change orders in an amount not-to-exceed 15 percent of the amount of the Microsoft Enterprise Agreement of \$2,614,896.36; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents pursuant to the Microsoft Enterprise Agreement and to make minor non-substantive changes.

CALIFORNIA NATURAL RESOURCES AGENCY GRANT - NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK HARADA HOUSE REHABILITATION - 3356 LEMON - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to submit a grant application to the California Natural Resources Agency, in the amount of \$3,000,000, to support rehabilitation of the National Historic Landmark Harada House located 3356 Lemon Street; (2) authorized, upon grant award, an increase in estimated revenues in the amount of the grant award into Revenue Account 9338600102-33410000 and appropriated expenditures in the same amount into Museum Department Account 9338600102-44021000; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to accept all grant assurances and certifications and execute all grant documents including making minor and non-substantive changes to documents associated with the grant application.

MEASURE Z - BID 7608 - HEAT, VENTILATION, AND AIR CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT - CESAR CHAVEZ COMMUNITY CENTER AT BOBBY BONDS PARK - 2060 UNIVERSITY

The City Council (1) awarded Bid 7608 to Western Air Conditioning Company Inc., Rancho Cucamonga, in the amount of \$63,600.00 from Measure Z Account 221500-424130 for providing and installing heating, ventilating, and air conditioning units at Cesar Chavez Community Center at Bobby Bonds Park located at 2060 University Avenue; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the construction contract with Western Air Conditioning Company, Inc., including making minor and non-substantive changes.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
TOBACCO GRANT PROGRAM - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

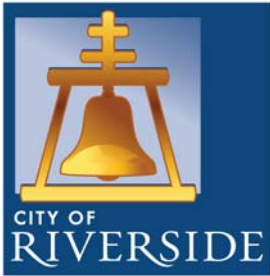
The City Council (1) approved the Memorandum of Understanding with the State of California, California Department of Justice to accept grant funding in the amount of \$99,858 from the Tobacco Grant Program to provide overtime for tobacco enforcement programs such as Minor Decoy and Shoulder Tap for December 1, 2018, through June 30, 2021; (2) authorized an increase in revenues in the amount of \$99,858 into Revenue Account 9338500-334100 and appropriated expenditures in the same amount to Police Department Account 9338500-440210 by the Finance Department for the State of California, California Department of Justice Tobacco Grant Program; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Memorandum of Understanding with the State of California, California Department of Justice Tobacco Grant Program, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

STREET LIGHT PROGRAM AND POLICIES UPDATE AND DESIGN GUIDE

The City Council adopted the Street Light Program and Policies update and Design Guide.

AGREEMENT - VAN BUREN BOULEVARD WIDENING PROJECT -
SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) approved the Agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments for \$160,000 in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funding for the planning and engineering phases of the Van Buren Boulevard Widening project to widen Van Buren Boulevard from Jurupa Avenue to the Santa Ana River Bridge; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments, including making minor, non-substantial changes; and (3) authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$160,000 in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funds to Van Buren Boulevard Widening Project Account 9840919-440315 and increase the estimated revenue by the same amount in Project Account 9840919-339100.



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AGREEMENT - IOWA AVENUE WIDENING PROJECT - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) approved the Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee Program Agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments to reimburse \$80,000 in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funding for the Iowa Avenue Widening Project widening Iowa Avenue from Martin Luther King Boulevard to University Avenue; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement with Western Riverside Council of Governments, including making minor and non-substantial changes; and (3) authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$80,000 in Transportation Uniform Mitigation Fee funds to the Iowa Avenue Widening Project Account 9899819-440315 and increase the estimated revenue by the same amount in the Project Account 9899819-339100.

FINAL TRACT MAP 37218 - VAN BUREN/WOOD - RESOLUTION

The City Council adopted the Resolution of Acceptance for final approval of Parcel Map 37218 to subdivide 1.62 acres into one lot for medical offices located at 18876 and 18890 Van Buren Boulevard, situated near the corner of Van Buren Boulevard and Wood Road; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23421 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Accepting the Final Map of Tract No. 37218, was presented and adopted.

5-TON WEIGHT LIMIT RESTRICTION - GREEN ORCHARD - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

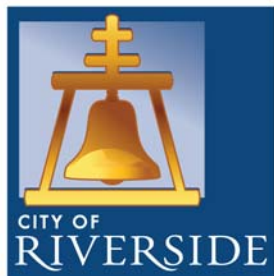
