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### AGREEMENT - DISPATCH SERVICES - RIVERSIDE COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) approved the Riverside Police Department Dispatch Service Agreement with Riverside Community College District for the term of July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2022, for provision of dispatch services in the amount of \$302,964.99 for year one, and an amount to be calculated on a cost-incurred basis for years two and three, not-to-exceed a 3 percent increase from the previous year; (2) authorized an increase in revenues in the amount of \$302,964.99 to Police Department, Communications Division Miscellaneous Revenue Account 3110000-341190 for Fiscal Year 2019-20 and an increase in expenditures in the same amount to the Communication Division Overtime at 1.5 Rate Account 3110000-413120; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all necessary documents to effectuate the agreement including making non-substantive changes to the agreement.

### TIME RESTRICTIONS ON DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITATION - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Chapter 5.08.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code regarding the hours of solicitation formerly 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., reduced to 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7463 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Chapter 5.08.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code Regarding the Hours of Solicitation, was presented and adopted.

FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 SECOND QUARTER CASH AND INVESTMENTS AND DEBT REPORT

The City Council received and ordered filed the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Second Quarter Cash and Investments and Debt Report.

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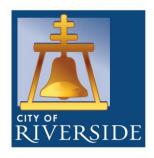
