

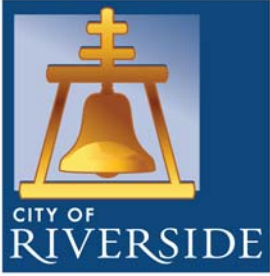

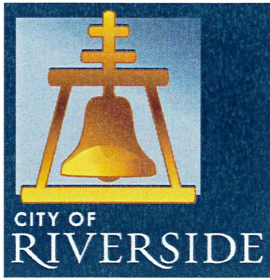

PUBLIC HEARINGS/PLANNING REFERRALS AND APPEALS

BUILDING PERMITS MORATORIUM - NORTHSIDE NEIGHBORHOOD - INTERIM ORDINANCE ADOPTED
 Hearing was called to consider adopting an interim ordinance establishing a temporary moratorium on all land use entitlements and building permits for industrial, manufacturing, distribution and/or warehouse uses on properties zoned, or proposed to be zoned, Business and Manufacturing Park (BMP) and General Industrial (I) within the Northside Neighborhood, for an initial period of no more than 45 days. Thirty-nine people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council adopted an interim ordinance for a temporary moratorium on land use entitlements and building permits for all industrial, manufacturing, distribution or warehouse uses on properties zoned, or proposed to be zoned, Business and Manufacturing Park (BMP) or General Industrial (I) within the Northside Neighborhood, based on the findings set forth in the staff report; whereupon, the title having been read and further
