

ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS AND UPDATE FROM THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER Mr. Watson stated that the Beacon Way appeal was heard by Council on February 11, 2020. The City Council bifurcated the project, approved the demolition and returned the design to the Cultural Heritage Board. This will be on the next agenda with a request for the formation of a subcommittee to work with the applicant. He also announced that the City has received the Governor's Historic Preservation Award for the Doors Open Event.										
Board Member Tobin asked that the Mills Act be agendized on the next agenda with respect to the report that was submitted to the City Council. He felt that Title 20 gives the Board authority to bring suggestions to Council pertaining to Title 20 which the Mills Act program also falls under.										
Mr. Tobin brought up the terms of the board members and noted that several members terms would be up in 2021. He asked that perhaps consideration should be given to recruiting for replacements. He noted that there are specific professions that must be recruited.
