ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM TWO-YEAR GRANT AGREEMENTS WITH REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA TO SUPPORT CLEAN AND GREEN STARTUP BUSINESSES AND TECHNOLOGY/INNOVATION ENTREPRENEURS THROUGHOUT THE INNOVATION DISTRICT AND CITY

Following discussion, it was moved by Member Hemenway and seconded by Vice Chair Edwards to recommend that the City Council (1) approve a two-year Economic Opportunity Program Grant Agreement, for Fiscal Years 2021/22 and 2022/23, in the amount of \$50,000, with the Regents of the University of California, a California non-profit corporation, on behalf of its Riverside campus Entrepreneurial Proof of Concept and Innovation Center Small Business Development Center (EPIC SBDC) Program, to support clean and green startup businesses and technology/innovation entrepreneurs (amongst others) throughout the Innovation District and the City; (2) approve a two-year Economic Opportunity Program Grant Agreement, for Fiscal Years 2021/22 and 2022/23, in the amount of \$50,000, with ExCite Riverside, a California non-profit corporation to support clean and green startup businesses and technology/innovation entrepreneurs (amongst others) throughout the Innovation District and the City; (3) authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Economic Opportunity Program Grant Agreement with the Regents of the University of California, on behalf

of its Riverside campus EPIC SBDC Program, including making minor and non-substantive changes to complete the transaction; and (4) authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Economic Opportunity Program Grant Agreement with ExCite Riverside including making minor and non-substantive changes to complete the transaction. The motion carried unanimously.

# FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022 CITY SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM FOR JANUARY 1 TO JUNE 30, 2022, FOR MONETARY AND/OR IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

Following discussion, it was moved by Vice Chair Edwards and seconded by Member Hemenway to (1) receive and order filed a review on staff recommendations for the City Sponsorship Program for the six-month period of January 1, 2022 – June 30, 2022; and (2) recommend that City Council approve City Sponsorship support in the form of monetary funding and/or in-kind contributions of \$148,969 for charitable and community events, which are produced by local non-profit organizations. The motion carried unanimously.

# FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 ARTS AND CULTURE GRANT PROGRAM AWARDS TO SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF ESTABLISHED ARTS AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS SERVING THE COMMUNITY

Following discussion, it was moved by Vice Member Edwards and seconded by Member Hemenway to recommend that the City Council (1) approve the Arts & Culture Grants for Fiscal Year 2021/22 in the total amount of \$288,484 for arts & culture organizations; and (2) authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute any necessary, financial, or legal documents with the approved organizations and/or artists, including making minor and non-substantive changes, to implement the City's Arts & Culture Grant program. The motion carried unanimously.

DEVELOPMENT OF AN ORDINANCE AND POTENTIAL BALLOT MEASURE AMENDING CHAPTER 19 OF THE RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE TO PROVIDE FOR A LEGAL AND REGULATORY FRAMEWORK FOR THE PERMITTING, LICENSING, ENFORCEMENT, TAXATION, AND LEGAL OPERATIONS OF COMMERCIAL CANNABIS STOREFRONTS WITHIN CITY LIMITS
