






Ecolane Scheduling Software was implemented at the beginning of 2025.

This new scheduling software will allow Riverside Connect to grow and give users of the service some added conveniences not available with our old scheduling software.

Most notably the mobile application that will allow users to request and schedule rides electronically.







New Buses

12 new 16 Passenger CNG Glaval Cutaways were approved by Council in March. The delivery date for those 12 buses is tentatively scheduled for November of 2025

• \$2,485,114.41 - FTA 5307 / State Transit Assistance Funds

10 new 16 Passenger CNG Glaval Cutaways will be seeking approval from Council on October 21

• \$2,286.902.13 - State Transit Assistance/State of Good Repair Funds

2 new Zero Emissions Electric Bus -

• \$696,461.60 - Courtesy of RPU's Low Carbon Fuel Standard (LCFS) funding







In compliance with California's Innovative Clean Transit Regulation, Riverside Connect will be making the transition to a Zero Emissions Fleet.

To help establish the infrastructure, The State of California has allocated Riverside Connect approximately 5 million from the *Transit* and *Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)*.



The City is still working on a plan to upgrade the infrastructure in the Corporate Yard to handle all of the electricity needed to charge the City's fleet vehicles

In the meantime, Transit is currently working on acquiring a mobile charging trailer that will be able to charge multiple electric buses at a time.
