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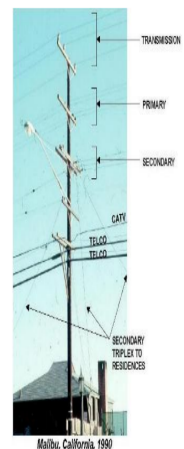
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## BACKGROUND

1. University of California (UCR) is currently expanding their fiber optic system to the Agricultural Operations Center Building
2. UCR needs to cross Martin Luther king Boulevard by attaching to two existing electric utility poles
3. Agreement is needed for the attachment of the facilities
4. The licensee would pay a one-time processing fee of \$67, per pole, and an ongoing annual license fee for each attachment (per foot of occupied usable pole space)
5. Initial ten-year term agreement

### Typical Utility Pole

- The structure used to support supply and or communication conductor cables and associated equipment
- Wood poles
- Concrete poles
- Metal poles
- Fiberglass



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# PROJECT LOCATION

1. The project area is located on Martin Luther King Boulevard west of Canyon Crest Drive, between UCR's Agricultural Operations and Parking lot 30



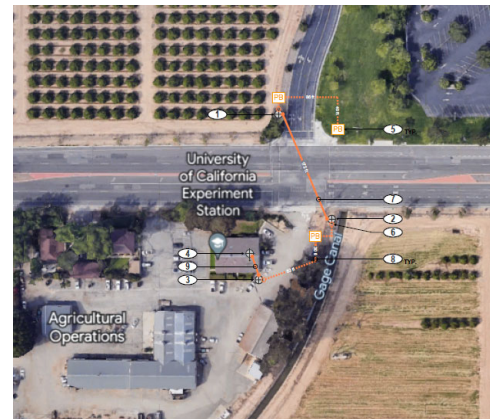
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# SCOPE OF WORK

1. Fiber aerial crossing
2. Installation of approximately 170' of Fiber between poles
3. Fiber to be provided and installed by UCR contractor
4. One (1) week to complete the work



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## FISCAL IMPACT

- Upon execution of the Agreement UCR one-time processing fee of \$67
- An ongoing annual license fee for each network equipment attachment
- Compliance with FCC 18-133 and reflected in the Agreement, Exhibits C-1.
