




## What is "Age-Friendly"?





#### Why is "Age-Friendly" Important?

- By 2060, nearly 1 in 4 people in the United States will be at least 65 years old.
- Knowing this turning point is on the horizon is an opportunity.
- For the last seven decades, the dominant development paradigm has been one primarily focused on meeting the perceived needs of families with children.





#### **Opportunities for Growth**

**AARP Study:** Two-thirds (67%) of all adults — and 79% of those 50plus — want to stay in their current communities. Adults primarily value communities that foster good health, promote street safety, and provide good opportunities for community engagement and social interaction.




#### **NAFSC: Pre-Enrollment**

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

#### **Community Assessment: Community Profile**


The community profile describes the demographics of your community.





#### **Community Assessment: Community Survey**


A survey to hear directly from your community members about their needs and wants.

Listening sessions augment the survey and are another way to directly engage with your community and provide a "face" to the age-friendly initiative.






