


California faced \$47B budget deficit in 2024

 Water conservation
 Infrastructure development



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SIGNIFICANT WATER LEGISLATION

- 1. AB 460 (passed)
 - a. Increased water rights violation penalties
 - b. New daily fines for curtailment orders
 - c. Enhanced monitoring requirements

2. SB 937 (passed)

- a. Modified connection fee collection timing
- b. New development fee structures
- c. Deferred payment options for residential projects

c. AB 3062: New fire notification requirements


2. Key Victory


a. AB 2221 (Failed): Maintained POU control over infrastructure safety

• Would have imposed strict broadband attachment timelines




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
