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BACKGROUND

- 1. The Active Transportation Program is administered by Caltrans to enhance public health and achieve equity-oriented outcomes through the deployment of biking and walking infrastructure
- 2. The City has participated in the ATP program with multiple successes since its inception in 2014.
- 3. On June 7, 2022 the City Council authorized submittal of both grant applications for the
 Five Points Project and Mitchell Ave Sidepath Project

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
BACKGROUND (CONTINUED)

- On August 7, 2023, Caltrans informed the City that grant applications were successfully awarded.
- For the Five Points Neighborhood Pedestrian Safety Improvements Project, the total project cost is \$7.416 M (including a local match of \$891,000)
- For the Mitchell Avenue Sidepath Gap Closure Project, the total project cost is \$7.465 M (including a local match of \$709,000)
