There are currently 23 parks that are allocated to youth and adult sport organizations.

43 Ball Fields with lights



40 Unlit and Lit Multi-Use fields

FIELD ALLOCATIONS

Ball fields and multi-use fields are allocated twice a year – Spring Season (February-June) and Fall Season (August-December).

Documents required when requesting a field permit:

- Facility Reservation Application
- Insurance
- League Information Form
- Musco Lighting Request Form



FIELD ALLOCATIONS

Permits issued for the Spring of 2024: **60 user groups**

- Youth: travel baseball/softball, Pony Leagues, Little Leagues, tackle football, flag football, soccer
- Adult: rugby, soccer, softball

Permits issued for the Spring and Fall of 2023: **124 user groups**

Permitted field hours for Spring and Fall of 2023: **76,076.10** hours

FIELD MAINTENANCE

PARKS DIVISION RESPONSIBILITY:

Seasonal Preparations and Renovations:

- Grading, leveling, and compacting of infield dirt
- Replacement of damaged home plates and base pegs
- Edging of all turf areas
- Grooming and repairs of pitching mounds
- Purchase of ball field clay/infield dirt
 - Little Leagues that wish to purchase additional clay/infield dirt must obtain approval from PRCSD and pay for additional materials.



FIELD MAINTENANCE PARKS DIVISION (CONT.)

Weekly Infield Maintenance:

- Dragging & watering of infields
- Edging/Mowing of Grass

Additional Maintenance:

- Replacing of backstop boards
- Work with Musco Lighting for replacement of lamps
- Repairs/replacement of irrigation/sprinklers

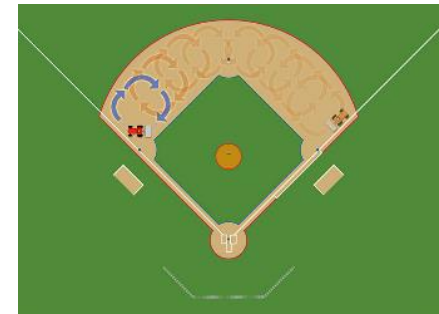
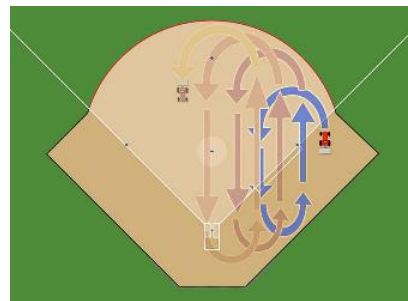
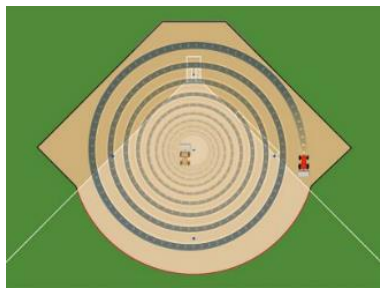
LITTLE LEAGUES RESPONSIBILITY

 - Parks Division provides leagues with infield grooming techniques

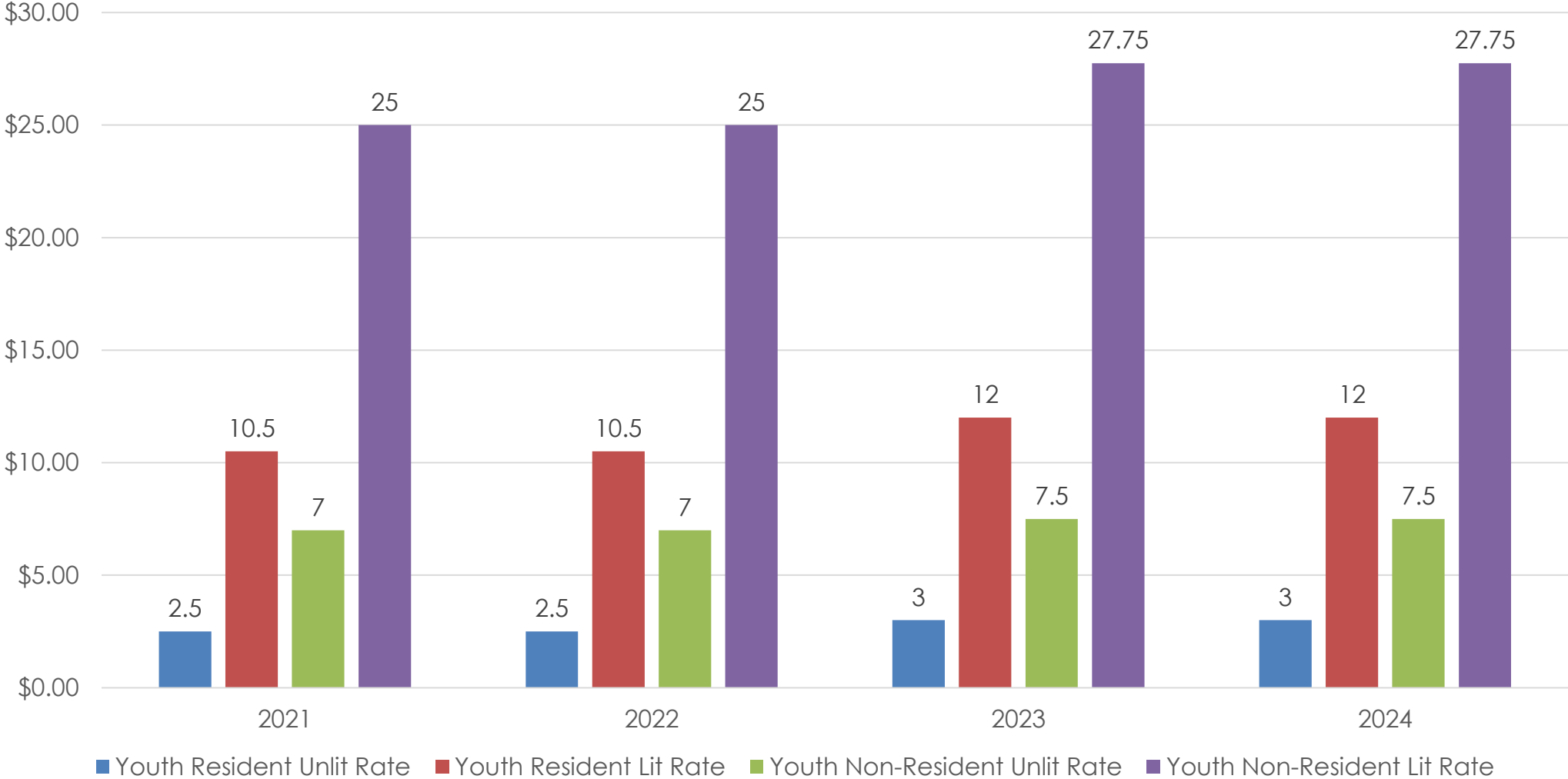


BALL FIELD RENOVATION REQUEST

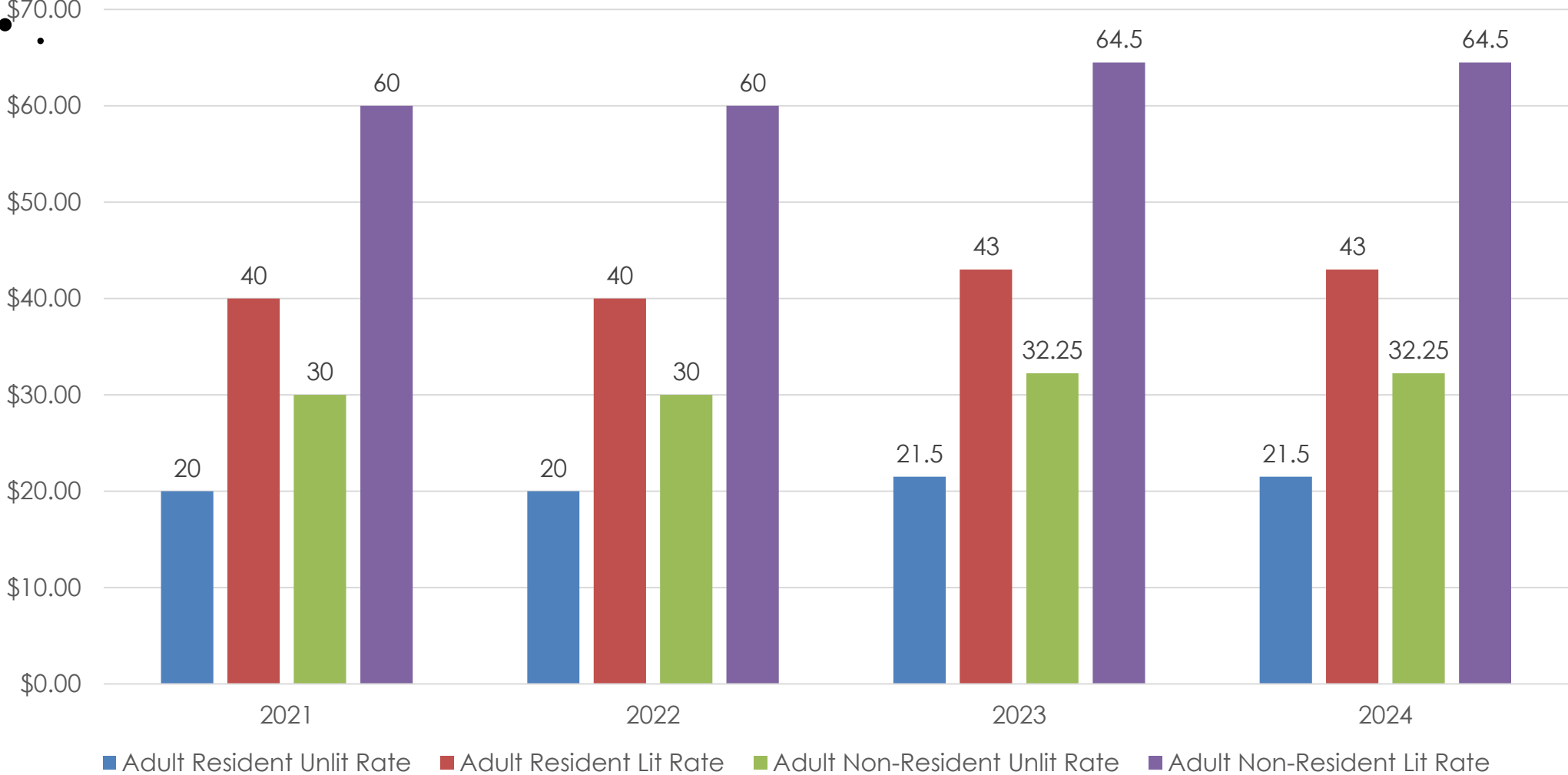
1. A request needs to be submitted to PRCSD (e.g. pitcher mound removal, dugout storage box, dugout shade covering)
 - a. Proposal, Quotes, Contractors Insurance

2. Once Approved by PRCSD Representative, the Leagues will:
 - a. Cover cost of purchasing and installing
 - b. Be responsible for maintenance of upgrade(s)
