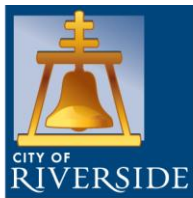

### ELECTION OF OFFICERS

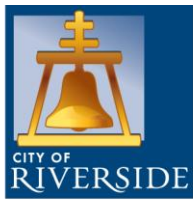
Commission Steven Delpino wanted clarification of the duties of the Airport Commission Chair and Co-Chair positions. Commission Cynthia Gibbs explained that the Chair conducts and is in control of the Airport Commission Meeting and the Co-Chair fills in for the Chair when the Chair is absent. After recommendations, Commissioner Delpino accepted the Airport Commissioner Chair position and Commissioner Carlos Trigueros accepted the Co-Chair position. Commissioners approved item number four unanimously congratulating Commissioner Delpino and Commissioner Trigueros on their new positions.

### MARCH 2026 AIRPORT MANAGERS' REPORT

Airport Manager Daniel Prather began his report by informing the Commission on his recent attendance at the Vertical Aviation International Convention in Atlanta (VERTICON). Prather discussed airport operations were up in the month of January of 2026 compared to the same month in 2025. Prather also discussed financial numbers current as of January 2026.

Prather informed the Commission of the results of the 2026 Airport Tenant Survey. Prather alluded to three main themes from the results of the survey which included the implementation of the red line on the airport ramp, the loss of automatic payments for airport billing and foreign object debris (FOD), gravel, weeds and rock around the airport. Results were based on questions asked, including prices at the airport compared to other airports, and the level of satisfaction with airport services, facilities and airport staff. Based on a scale of 1-5 the airport ranked 4.32 in 2026 compared to 4.02 in 2025.

Prather updated the commission of the upcoming council items which included the application for a seven and a half million dollar grant for improvements to the terminal parking lot, Flight Road, Gemende Drive, and various traffic operations surrounding the airport.

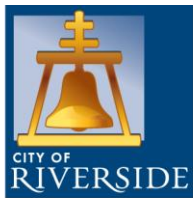
Prather spoke about other upcoming council items such as a supplemental agreement with Mead & Hunt, a five-year lease extension with CAVU Maintenance, a five-year lease extension agreement with Commemorative Air Force and a ten-year lease extension agreement with Waypoint Aviation.

Commissioner David Lofthouse started the discussion asking to clarify the airport's fuel flowage fees which was a question on the tenant survey. Prather explained that the airport charges a fee of ten cents per gallon purchased to the owners of each fuel station at the airport. Prather added that most general aviation airports do not charge a landing fee and instead charge fuel flowage fees to help offset costs. Lofthouse added that he attended the tenant appreciation meeting on February 19<sup>th</sup> and was asked by a tenant about the possibility of expanding the airport's transient parking spaces. Prather eluded that space at the airport is at a premium and current ramp space is maxed out. Prather said the future of the westside expansion project could open more transient parking spots.

Commissioner Trigueros asked about the possibility of more office staff in reference to the results from the tenant survey. Prather agreed that more office staff are needed and that will be addressed in the fall.

Commissioner Briggs Gamblin asked how much of the westside project would be dedicated to transient parking. Prather stated that the westside would be one hundred percent aeronautical with a mixture of tiedowns, hangars and a possible fuel facility.

Commissioner Delpino asked if the airport was looking into additional revenue streams. Prather informed the commission that the economic development plan and the economic impact study that is currently in the works will evaluate uses of airport land and future business partnerships. Prather also stated that the former ten thousand square foot Flight Service Station is in possible renovation stages which could bring the airport between ten to twelve thousand dollars in revenue monthly.

Commissioner Delpino asked to clarify about the loss of the automatic payment system opportunity from the tenant survey results. Prather stated that this was an internal decision made by the city and that the goal is to implement a tenant portal where tenants can view billing and make maintenance requests.

Delpino then asked for more information on the long-term lease agreements with CAVU, Commemorative Air Force and Waypoint Aviation. Prather made the point that these extensions were in their respective lease agreements and each tenant was exercising their option to renew. Discussion followed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Loffhouse and a second by Commissioner Gambin to approve the March Airport Managers Report as presented. Commissioners approved items number five unanimously.

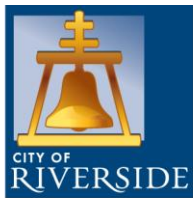
#### UPDATES OF CONFERENCES, SEMINARS, AND REGIONAL MEETINGS ATTENDED BY COMMISSIONERS
