

1 RESOLUTION NO.

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE,
3 CALIFORNIA, ORDERING, CALLING, PROVIDING FOR AND GIVING
4 NOTICE OF A MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON JUNE 2, 2026
5 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS
6 OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, A MEASURE TO UPDATE THE CITY'S
7 TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX UNTIL ENDED BY THE VOTERS.

8 WHEREAS, the City of Riverside has an existing transient occupancy tax ordinance which is
9 set forth in Chapter 5.32 of the Riverside Municipal Code and which was initially adopted by the City
10 in 1966, and which provides for a tax to be imposed on the privilege of occupying rooms within hotels,
11 motels, inns and other dwelling units within the City for periods of less than thirty days; and

12 WHEREAS, the existing transient occupancy tax rate set forth in Chapter 5.32 has not been
13 updated since 2014; and

14 WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to provide for an update of the transient occupancy
15 tax rate, by increasing the tax rate from thirteen percent (13%) to fourteen percent (14%); and

16 WHEREAS, Article XIIC of the California Constitution and Government Code section 53723,
17 require that such a general tax must be submitted to, and approved by, a majority of those qualified
18 electors voting in an election to be held on the issue of imposing the general tax; and

19 WHEREAS, the proposed measure can address community identified City service priorities
20 such as, maintaining 911, fire and police response, preventing property crimes, such as theft and home
21 burglaries, preparing for and responding to wildfires, keeping public areas safe and clean, preventing
22 homeless encampment fires and recruiting and retaining well-trained firefighters and paramedics; and

23 WHEREAS, the proposed measure is not a tax on Riverside residents or taxpayers who are not
24 Riverside hotel or motel guests; and

25 WHEREAS, the proposed measure allows visitors to the City of Riverside to contribute
26 towards the local impacts of tourism and the cost to maintain the 911 services, streets and roads that
27 they use; and

28 WHEREAS, existing voter approved transient occupancy tax (TOT) funding has maintained
public safety services in Riverside; and

WHEREAS, approximately 70% of all 911 calls to the Riverside Fire Department require
emergency medical attention, including heart attacks incidents; according to the American Heart

1 Association, strokes and brain deterioration can start between four to six minutes after a person stops
2 breathing and the City needs to be able to maintain fast emergency response times; and

3 WHEREAS, the City needs to have the ability to fight gang violence by maintaining anti-gang
4 programs for at-risk youth, and keeping gang members and drug dealers from nearby communities out
5 of our City; and

6 WHEREAS, the measure will include strict accountability provisions including public
7 disclosure of all spending, annual independent financial audits, and performance reports available
8 online, and with all funds generated by the measure used exclusively for the City of Riverside
9 community

10 WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code section 9222, the City Council has authority to place
11 local measures on the ballot to be considered at a municipal election; and

12 WHEREAS, on January 6, 2026, the City Council adopted Resolution 24342, ordering, calling,
13 providing for and giving notice of a General Municipal Election to be held in the City of Riverside on
14 the 2nd day of June, 2026, for the purpose of electing a member of the City Council for the second,
15 fourth, and sixth wards of the City of Riverside, and giving notice and ordering that said General
16 Municipal Election is consolidated with all other elections being held in the same territory on the same
17 date; and

18 WHEREAS, the City Council desires to submit a ballot measure to the voters at the June 2,
19 2026 General Municipal Election.

20 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, on the
21 basis of the foregoing recitals and staff reports submitted by City staff at the March 3, 2026 City
22 Council meeting, as follows:

23 Section 1: The City Council, pursuant to its right and authority under California law,
24 approves the proposed ordinance as set forth on Exhibit “1”, attached hereto and incorporated herein
25 by reference, and hereby orders that the following measure to be submitted to the qualified electors of
26 the City of Riverside at the general municipal election to be held on June 2, 2026:

27 *City of Riverside Hotel Tax Measure. To maintain local funding federal/state*
28 *governments cannot take and City funds for services such as public safety;*

1 *youth/senior programs; libraries/parks; improve the City of Riverside Convention*
2 *Center to promote tourism/economic growth, shall the measure updating the City's*
3 *existing transient occupancy tax (paid only by hotel/motel guests) from 13% to*
4 *14%, providing approximately \$640,000 annually until ended by voters; requiring*
5 *audits and public spending disclosure, be adopted?*

6 Section 2: That only the qualified electors of the City of Riverside are entitled to vote at
7 said election on this measure and that if a majority of the qualified electors voting on the measure
8 votes in favor of the measure, the measure shall be deemed approved.

9 Section 3: The City Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of the measure to the City
10 Attorney, wherein an impartial analysis of the measure shall be prepared pursuant to Elections Code
11 section 9280, showing the effect on the existing law and the operation of the measure. The analysis
12 shall be printed preceding the arguments for and against the measure.

13 Section 4: That in accordance with the provisions of Section 501 of the Charter of the City
14 of Riverside and the Constitution and election laws of the State of California, a municipal election be
15 held and the same is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of Riverside on June 2, 2026, for
16 the purpose of submitting a measure to adopt an ordinance amending Chapter 5.32 of the Riverside
17 Municipal Code to increase the City's transient occupancy tax to 14% until ended by the voters.

18 Section 5: That in accordance with Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the City Council
19 hereby requests the Riverside County Board of Supervisors to consent to consolidation of the
20 municipal election with the Statewide election to be held on the same day.

21 Section 6: That the City Council consents to the consolidation of the municipal election
22 hereby called with all other elections being held in the same territory on June 2, 2026, and said
23 elections, where possible, shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election within the City
24 of Riverside and only one form of ballot shall be used and the precincts, polling places and officers of
25 election for said elections shall be the same as provided for the municipal election.

26 Section 7: That for the purpose of holding said municipal election there shall be and hereby
27 are established consolidated voting precincts, consisting of a consolidation of the regular election
28

1 precincts in the City of Riverside established for the holding of state and county elections as said
2 regular election precincts exist on the date of this resolution.

3 Section 8: That the form and contents of the ballots to be used at the said election shall be
4 as provided by law.

5 Section 9: That the polls for said election shall be opened at 7:00 a.m. of the day of said
6 election and shall remain open continuously from said time until 8:00 p.m. of the same day, when the
7 polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14401 of the Elections Code.

8 Section 10: That in accordance with Section 10002 of the Elections Code, the Board of
9 Supervisors of Riverside County is hereby requested to consent to the Registrar of Voters rendering
10 election services to the City of Riverside as may be requested by the City Clerk of said City, the County
11 of Riverside to be reimbursed in full for such services as are performed.

12 Section 11: That the City Clerk shall have charge of all City elections pursuant to Riverside
13 City Charter Section 703(f).

14 Section 12: That the City Clerk is hereby designated the "Elections Official" for the
15 purposes of this election pursuant to Elections Code section 320(b).

16 Section 13: That based upon the foregoing authority, the City Clerk shall have charge of
17 this election and shall make all determinations necessary to conduct this election.

18 Section 14: Pursuant to Section 9298 of the Election Code, the City Council, or any member
19 or members of the City Council authorized by the body, or any individual voter who is eligible to vote
20 on the measure or bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of voters and associations,
21 may file a written argument, not to exceed 300 words in length, accompanied by the printed name(s)
22 and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name
23 of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers, for or
24 against the measure. In the event that more than one argument for or against a measure is timely
25 submitted, the City's Elections Official shall give preference and priority in the order set forth in
26 Section 9287 of the Elections Code.

27 Section 15: The City Council elects to authorize rebuttal arguments pursuant to Elections
28 Code Section 9285. When the City's Elections Official has selected the arguments for and against the

1 measure to be printed and distributed to the voters, the elections official shall send copies of the
2 argument in favor of the measure to the authors of the argument against, and copies of the argument
3 against to the authors of the argument in favor. The author or a majority of the authors of an argument
4 relating to the foregoing city measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument not to exceed two
5 hundred and fifty (250) words in length. The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk not
6 more than ten (10) days after the final date for filing direct arguments.

7 Section 16: That the City Clerk of said City shall receive the canvass of the municipal
8 election and shall certify the results to this City Council, as required by law.
