SUBJECT: AIRPORT MANAGER'S OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITY REPORT

ISSUE:

Receive the August 2024 Airport Manager's Operations and Activity Report, which includes January-June 2024 aircraft operations data, July 2023-June 2024 financial data, and review of airport highlights and events.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Airport Commission receive this August 2024 Airport Manager's Operations and Activity Report.

BACKGROUND:

The Airport Manager's Operation and Activity Report is provided to inform the Airport Commission (Commission) about operations, City Council actions, events, meetings and other issues concerning the Riverside Municipal Airport (Airport).

DISCUSSION:

This update includes information about Airport operations, financials, and a proposal to rename the Airport.

Key Operational and Financial Statistics

The first six months of 2024 were 16.5% more active with aircraft operational activity than the same period in 2023. There was also a double-digit percentage increase (12.5%) in June 2024, as compared to June 2023. As air traffic control tower staffing increases (currently with four controllers), this increased operational activity can be accommodated.

Although operating expenditures were 6.7% over budget at the end of the fiscal year, operating revenues were almost three times that variance, at 18% over budget. Expenditures exceeded budget largely due to higher than anticipated costs for Insurance and Motor Pool Equipment Rental, which covers Airport vehicles usage and replacement costs. On the revenues side, increases include revenue share collected from the Van Buren Golf Course and the Fuel Flowage Fee increase from \$.05 to \$.10 per gallon. In addition, Finance implemented an option for tenants to pay their invoices online, which has resulted in better collection.

As we begin a new FY, operating expenditures will be managed to ensure that actual expenditures closely match budgeted amounts. Airport staff will continue to aggressively pursue increased operating revenues, to include development of new land leases, supporting the continued growth of the airport café, and implementation of an advertising program.

Highlights

Federal Aviation Administration Flight Standards District Office Move In

The renovation of the building that houses the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Flight Standards District Office (FSDO) is complete. With a new roof, parapet wall, stucco, paint, and landscaping, the facility is now water-tight and adds a much-enhanced aesthetic value to the airport. FAA FSDO staff have moved back into the facility.

Anti-Human Trafficking Campaign

To ensure our airport is on the leading edge of safety and security, including ensuring the welfare of persons visiting our airport, the Airport has installed posters in all restrooms that highlight the National Human Trafficking Hotline. The Airport is proud to partner with the U.S.

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Department of Transportation to combat human trafficking by empowering airport employees and the traveling public to recognize and report possible instances of human trafficking.

New Airport Café Entrance

To accommodate construction activity for the upcoming airport terminal restroom renovation project, and an expanded kitchen at the Riverside Airport Café, the Café entrance has been relocated temporarily to the airport terminal lobby doors. Sufficient signage is in place to direct patrons to the new entrance.
