

RECOVERY FOR UNPAID ACCOUNTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE AND ABATEMENT COSTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024

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BACKGROUND

- 1. The Administrative Code Enforcement Program was adopted by the City Council on July 13, 1999, establishing a means for cost recovery for Code Enforcement processes.
- 2. The City is required to conduct a public hearing on the nuisance abatement costs.
- 3. Notice of Public Hearing was published in the Press Enterprise on June 25, 2024.



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CODE ENFORCEMENT STATISTICS

- 1. For Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the Code Enforcement Division has processed approximately 12,790 code cases.
- 2. The total number of properties with uncollected administrative and abatement costs, under consideration today is 41 properties, less than 1% of all cases.
