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## Background

- **2015:** Last citywide fees and charges study
- **2021:** Fees and charges study initiated
- **2022:** Study placed on hold pending new City Manager
- **2023:** 7.5% CPI increase adopted pending completion of the study
- **2023-2024:** Study refreshed with updated data.

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# What are User Fees?

- **Recover costs** of programs that provide direct **benefit to an individual or business** requesting a specific service.
- **Reduce subsidies** from general purpose revenues, primarily taxpayer dollars
- May not exceed the **estimated “reasonable” cost** of providing service activity



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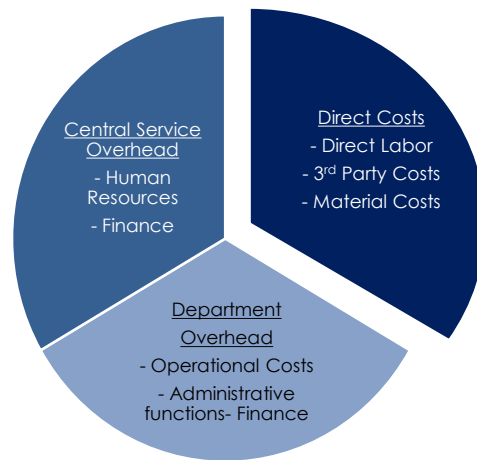
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# Fee Study

## Purpose & Methodology

- Performed every 3 - 5 years
- Determine the “reasonable” full cost of providing services
  - Up to 100% of the full cost may be recovered
- Comparison Studies
- Community Engagement
- Facilitates informed decision making based on the City’s goals and values

## Recommended Fee Recovery Policy

### 100 % Cost Recovery

### Partial Cost Recovery

- Arts & Cultural Affairs – 7%
- Animal Services – 49%
- Recreation Programs – 33%
- Finance Non-sufficient funds & Tax-Free Certificate Processing – 60%
- Library – 15%

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## RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

1. Conduct a public hearing on the City of Riverside's Proposed Fiscal Year 2024/25 Master Fees and Charges Schedule;
2. Adopt an ordinance amending the Riverside Municipal Code (RMC) Chapter 3.30 Section 3.30.030 – Schedule of Regulation, Products and Services, subsection II – Finance, to add one additional category titled Convenience Fees and subsection VII – Public Safety – Fire, to add eleven additional categories titled Final As-Built (Revision) Plan Check, Fire Protection Plan (FPP) Review, Hazardous Material Analysis Report, High Pile, Defensible Space Review / Inspection, Performance Based Review, Alternative Means And Method Review, Rocket Launch, Burn Permit, Blasting Permit, Fire Alarm Control Panel / Communicator (Charge Out Only), and revise one category titled Petroleum Tank Inspection - Above Ground (APSA) to Third and Subsequent Plan Review Submittal; and
3. Adopt a resolution approving the Proposed Fiscal Year 2024/25 Master Fees and Charges Schedule.

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
