SUBJECT: TRAINING ON VARIOUS POLICE PROCEDURES

ISSUE:

Training on Various Police Procedures

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Community Police Review Commission (CPRC) select two dates for a police training session covering the following topics:

- 1. Shoot/Don't Shoot Scenarios;
- 2. Searches and Arresting Techniques;
- 3. Best Practices for Conducting Traffic Stops;
- 4. Taser Use and Presentation; and
- De-escalation Techniques and Process.

BACKGROUND:

The CPRC has identified the need for comprehensive training on key aspects of law enforcement interactions and procedures. These topics are important for the commission to understand current and best practices and protocols, providing them with a well-rounded perspective when reviewing complaint and officer involved death cases.

DISCUSSION:

The proposed training sessions will offer detailed, interactive classroom presentations and simulations covering each of the requested topics. The training day will be 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. To ensure compliance with the Brown Act, the commissioners will be divided into groups of no more than four members.

The Commission is requested to select two of the most suitable dates from the following options and sign up for one of them:

- Tuesday, July 22, 2025
- Wednesday, July 23, 2025
- Tuesday, July 29, 2025
- Thursday, July 31, 2025

Coordination with Riverside Police Department staff will be required to ensure the logistics of these training sessions. It is important that commissioners commit to a scheduled time for the training.
