Inland SoCal United Way

- Established in 1931
- Originally United Way of the Inland Valleys
- Serves over 1 million low-income people each year
- Already successful in implementing financial assistance models

CA DEPT OF SOCIAL SERVICES GRANT



- Guaranteed Income (GI) Pilot Program grant opportunity announced July 2022
 - Provides unconditional, individual, regular cash payments intended to support basic needs of recipients



- Inland Southern California United Way (ISCUW) received \$5 million grant award
 - 1 of 7 pilot programs statewide
 - Grant requires 1:1 matching funds

GUARANTEED INCOME PILOT PROGRAM



500 pregnant people and 150 Transition Age Foster



Youth will receive payments



Wraparound services will be offered to all participants



18 monthly payments of \$600



Total \$10,800 per participant

Low income is defined as 200% LMI or below

 Goal: Decrease burden of new costs during first year of life




150 low-income youth aging out of extended foster care program (turning 21 years of age)

TIMELINE

Matching funds need to be committed by August 2023

July 1, 2023 – Ramp up phase begins; partner convening and wraparound services planning; enrollment and outreach to participants

January 1, 2024 – Payments begin to participants

UNITED WAY'S ASK

- \$1 million in matching funds, available from the interest earned on City ARPA funds
 - The purpose of ARPA funds is to help people post-COVID
- No ARPA money would come from projects already approved by City Council

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Receive a report and consider matching funds to Inland Southern California United Way for a grant-funded Guaranteed Income Pilot Program;
- 2. With at least five affirmative votes, authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record a supplemental appropriation from American Rescue Plan interest earnings, for grant match purposes, in the amount of \$1,000,000 in the Grants & Restricted Programs Fund, United Way Guaranteed Income Program; and
- 3. Authorize the City Manager to execute all documents necessary to complete the transaction, including making minor and non-substantive changes.
