BACKGROUND

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BACKGROUND

- 1. The Public Works Department Wastewater Division is responsible for the collection and treatment of wastewater generated within the City of Riverside and the communities of Edgemont, Highgrove, Jurupa & Rubidoux.
- 2. To satisfy the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit, wastewater must be treated to achieve regulatory water quality standards. The RWQCP treatment processes require the use of various chemicals to achieve water quality objectives.

DISCUSSION

- 1. Under Purchasing Resolution No. 23914 Section 404, chemicals are considered to be items "peculiar to the needs of the Sewer Utility" and can be purchased through informal or negotiated procurement, providing this is in the best interest of the City
- Staff conducted a general market analysis comparing price ranges of current vendors to other businesses who offer similar goods. Market volatility, temporary supply shortages, and a Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase created an unexpected rise in unit costs for chemicals.

- 2. Approve an annual Purchase Order with Kemira Water Solutions, Inc., of Fontana, California, for ferric chloride in the amount of \$945,000;
- 3. Approve an annual Purchase Order with Univar USA, Inc., of Kent, Washington, for sodium bisulfite in the amount of \$735,000;
- 4. Approve an annual Purchase Order with Pioneer Americas, LLC., of Wilmington, Delaware, for sodium hypochlorite in the amount of \$1,820,000; and
- 5. Approve an annual Purchase Order with SNF Polydyne, Inc., of Riceboro, Georgia, for polymer in the amount of \$1,470,000.
