AIRCRAFT HANGAR DONATION - MUNICIPAL AIRPORT - 6951 FLIGHT

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Edwards and seconded by Councilmember Cervantes to (1) approve the acceptance of a grant award in the amount of \$11,104,807, under the 2023 Safe Streets For All (SS4A) Program as administered by the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for the construction of the South Main Complete Streets Project and the development of Citywide supplemental safety action plans; (2) authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute all necessary documents in the process of securing funds under the 2023 Safe Streets For All (SS4A) Program, including making minor and non-substantive changes and executing agreement amendments and extensions, subject to the availability of budgeted funds; (3) authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record an increase in grant revenue and appropriate expenditures in the amounts of \$10,784,807 in the Capital Outlay-Grants Fund, South Main Complete Streets Project revenue and expenditure

accounts and \$320,000 in the Capital Outlay-Grants Fund, Speed Limit Reduction Project revenue and expenditure accounts; and (4) authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record a supplemental appropriation in the amounts of \$2,696,202 in the Measure A Fund, South Main Complete Streets expenditure account and \$80,000 in the Measure A Fund, Speed Limit Reduction Project expenditure account, for the City match portion of the grant. Following discussion and without formal motion, the City Council received and ordered filed an update from the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) regarding the 2024 Draft Traffic Relief Plan.

CONSIDER RETENTION OF OUTSIDE COUNSEL OR REALLOCATE FUND TO HIRE ADDITIONAL CITY ATTORNEY OFFICE STAFF

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Cervantes and seconded by Councilmember Edwards to authorize an increase in 5.0 Full Time Equivalent positions in the Liability Trust Fund, City Attorney's Office, and approve re-allocation of \$220,855 from the Liability Trust Fund, Outside Legal Services account to the Liability Trust Fund, Salary and Benefits accounts to hire 2 additional Sr. Deputy City Attorneys, 1 Paralegal, and 2 Legal Secretaries to handle this matter and other matters currently being handled by outside counsel. The motion carried with Councilmember Conder voting no.
