ISSUE:

Open the nominations process for the Commission on Aging and vote to select a Chair and Vice Chair.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission on Aging:

1. Open the nomination process for the Commission on Aging

BACKGROUND:

In accordance with the Riverside City Charter Article V, Section 1, The officers of the Commission shall be the Chairperson and two Vice chairpersons. To comply with terms of Section 804 of the City Charter, one member will be formally elected Chairperson. Also, the Chairperson will sign all official documents.

Riverside City Charter Article V, Section 2: The Chairperson and the Vice Chairpersons shall be elected and take office at the meeting in March of each year from the members of the Commission. The March election will be preceded by a slate of nominees presented to the Commission in February. The nominating committee will consist of two (2) Commission members appointed by the Chairperson.
