Chair Bell convened the meeting at 5:32 p.m.

Commissioner Hundley led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

A moment of silence was observed.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Commissioner Ferguson nominated Chair Bell to serve a second term as Chair, and Vice Chair Gutierrez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

For Vice Chair, Commissioner Teichert nominated Vice Chair Gutierrez to continue in the role. Commissioner Ferguson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously for Vice Chair Gutierrez to serve a second term.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE

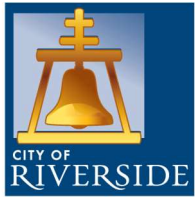
There was one participant wishing to address the Community Police Review Commission (CPRC) in chambers and no callers online. The Commission received no e-comment prior to the meeting.

DISCUSSION CALENDAR

Ad-Hoc Committee for Bylaws and Policies and Procedures

Following discussion, a motion by Commissioner Teichert and a second by Commissioner Lundy to adopt the redlined version of the policies, procedures, and bylaws without requiring written rationale. During closed session, the Commission will assess whether providing a rationale is practical and necessary, and, if so, consider amending the policies, procedures, and bylaws accordingly if it is feasible to implement. The motion carried with Commissioner Dillon absent.

Racial and Identity Profiling Act (RIPA) Ad Hoc Policy Recommendation

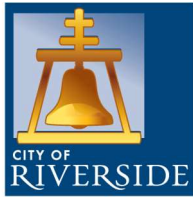
Following discussion, Commission Teichert motioned to forward the Ad-Hoc Committee's recommendation to the Safety, Wellness and Youth Committee with editorial changes reflecting today's discussion. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Gutierrez.

A substitutes motion was then made by Vice Chair Gutierrez, seconded by Commissioner Lundy, to continue the item to the next meeting to allow the CPRC to review and discuss the proposed edits prior to making a recommendation to the Safety, Wellness, and Youth Committee. The motion carried with Commissioner Dillon absent.

Review of draft 2025 Community Police Review Commission Report

Commissioner Ward motioned to include the 2025 Ad Hoc Committees in the report, listing each committee's name, members, the issues discussed, and the resulting actions or resolutions. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lundy. The motion carried with Commissioner Dillon absent.

Vice Chair Gutierrez then motioned to continue the item to the next meeting to incorporate the proposed revisions. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ferguson and carried, with Commissioner Dillon absent.

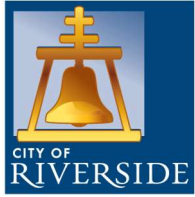
UPDATES FROM THE CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE
