What started in 2021 with just 89 subscribers has grown into a thriving newsroom, delivering free, community-centered journalism to over 14,000 subscribers every morning. Pardee sits on the Economic Development Committee for both the Chamber and The Raincross Group, the Chamber's Downtown Council, and the Supervisory Committee for Altura Credit Union. He has previously served on the board of The Pick Group of Young Professionals, working to address Riverside's "brain drain" challenges.

A proud graduate of Riverside City College and California State University, San Bernardino, he is committed to creating high-quality jobs and career opportunities that help Riverside take its rightful place on the national stage. A lifelong Riversider, Pardee's commitment to the city runs deep.
