BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The attached list includes the thirteen (13) applications reviewed and approved (Exhibit 1) during the 1st Quarter of 2025 (January 1 – March 31, 2025). In summary:

- One Landmark Designation was approved by the City Council, Mercantile Hall Orange Valley Masonic Lodge;
- One Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) was approved by the Cultural Heritage Board, after-the-fact artificial turf;
- Eleven (11) COAs approved by staff including, but not limited to, garage conversions to Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs), new detached ADUs, a rear addition, landscaping, signage, and window replacements.
