SUBJECT: RACIAL AND IDENTITY PROFILING ACT (RIPA) PROPOSED POLICY

ISSUE:

CPRC has been asked to review RIPA reports and provide feedback and recommendation as to policy and procedural practices that could lead to mitigation of any issues suggested by the results of the data analysis.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Community Police Review Commission:

1. Provide input on data analysis methodology
2. Provide input on data interpretation
3. Further inquiry regarding RIPA audits by RPD
4. Actions by the Community Police Review Commission

BACKGROUND:

In June of 2025, the CPRC was asked to provide feedback and policy recommendations on the 2025 RIPA Report. As a result, a sub-committee was formed to further identify recommendations for the police and city leadership to consider for purposes of improving any identifiable concerns with the report results.

DISCUSSION:

At the March 25, 2026, CPRC meeting, the Chair of the RIPA Ad-Hoc Committee presented the committee's recommendations to the Chief of Police, which prompted substantial dialogue. Following discussion, a motion was made by Vice Chair Gutierrez, seconded by Commissioner Lundy, to continue the item to the next meeting to allow the CPRC to review and discuss the proposed edits prior to making a recommendation to the Safety, Wellness, and Youth Committee. The motion carried, with Commissioner Dillon absent.

At the April 22, 2026 meeting, Commissioner Teichert moved to continue the Ad Hoc Committee's recommendation to the May CPRC meeting and directed that that report be revised to clearly specify the action the CPRC is recommending to the Safety, Wellness, and Youth Committee.
