SUBJECT: COLLECTION ACTIVITY FOR FY2024-2025

ISSUE:

Receive and file the Collection Activity report for FY2024-2025.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Museum of Riverside Board receive and file the Collection Activity report for FY2024-2025.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to the Standing Rules of the Museum of Riverside Board (Board), the Board approves recommendations to accession or deaccession objects to or from the permanent collection. The relevant sections of the Standing Rules are 1.F. and 1.G. The permanent collection is the category of collection for which the Museum assumes long-term responsibility, including fiduciary responsibility. Annually, staff prepares a summary report on activity associated with the permanent collection and other collections, in order to keep the Board apprised of the full scope of the mission-based responsibility to steward the collection, hold it in trust for the public, and meet obligations to donors.

DISCUSSION:

On May 25, 2022, the Museum Board approved the staff's recommendation to lift the collecting moratorium established in February 2017.

A list of additions (accessions) to the permanent collection follows. Two additions are also listed to the community collection, a category of collection from which loans are permitted to sites other than museums. Community collection donations may also include born-digital content requiring no physical storage space. All but one of the acquisitions in FY2023-2024 were by donation or transfer; the exception was A1941, acquired by purchase with funds donated by the Riverside Museum Associates.

Following prudent collections stewardship practices, selected objects were examined for continuing fit to mission and other considerations, which resulted in recommendations to remove objects formally from the permanent collection (deaccessions). Professional exchange in the form of object loans from and to the Museum occurred.

Thus, collection activity continued in the following categories: accessions into the permanent collections, deaccessions from the permanent collection, additions to the community collection, and outgoing loans. The following chart lists all objects for which transactions were active and/or finalized in FY2024-2025. Actions are reviewed and approved by the Collections Committee of the Museum of Riverside. When required by Riverside Municipal Code or Museum policy, actions are also approved by the Museum of Riverside Board and by Riverside City Council.
