A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE. CALIFORNIA, PURSUANT TO RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 5.77.120, TO FURTHER POSTPONE THE CITY'S EVALUATION AND REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS FOR STOREFRONT RETAIL COMMERCIAL CANNABIS BUSINESS PERMITS UP TO 30 ADDITIONAL DAYS FOR A TOTAL POSTPONEMENT OF 120 DAYS

WHEREAS, Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution authorizes cities to make and enforce, within their jurisdictional limits, ordinances and regulations not in conflict with general laws to protect and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

10 WHEREAS, on November 8, 2016, California voters approved Proposition 64, titled the Adult Use of Marijuana Act and enacted a state statutory scheme legalizing, controlling, 12 and regulating the cultivation, processing, manufacturing, distribution, testing, and sale of 13 nonmedical ("adult-use" or "recreational") cannabis, including cannabis, products, for use by adults twenty-one years of age and older; and

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WHEREAS, on June 27, 2017, the Medical and Adult Use Cannabis Regulation and 16 Safety Act was signed into law, which provides a comprehensive regulatory framework for licensing, control, and taxation of medical and adult-use cannabis-related businesses in 18 California; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Riverside ("City Council") desired to 20 establish a strong and effective regulatory system with regard to cannabis businesses that 21 protects the public health, safety and environmental resources, provides a consistent 22 regulatory pathway for the cannabis industry consistent with state regulations, fosters a 23 healthy, diverse and economically viable cannabis industry that contributes to the local 24 economy, and ensures that environmental, public health, safety and nuisance factors related 25 to the cannabis industry are adequately addressed; and 26

WHEREAS, in furtherance of these goals, on February 28, 2023, the City Council 27 introduced and on March 14, 2023, adopted, Ordinance 7628, amending Riverside Municipal Code 28

Chapter 5.77 (Cannabis Business Activities), in its entirety, Ordinance 7629 amending RMC Title 9 (Peace, Safety and Morals), and Ordinance 7630 amending RMC Title 19 (Zoning) of the RMC; and

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WHEREAS, Chapter 5.77 of the RMC regulates Cannabis Business Activities in the City of Riverside ("Cannabis Business Activities Ordinance"), including the types of businesses and maximum number permitted within the City, the permitting of up to 14 storefront retail commercial cannabis businesses and an unlimited number of manufacturing, distribution, and testing laboratories; and

8 WHEREAS, on October 17, 2023, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 24048 establishing the rules and regulations entitled Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis 10 Business Permit Procedure Guidelines and Application Review Criteria ("Permit 11 Guidelines"), as required by RMC Section 5.77.130(A); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Permit Guidelines, the City reviewed and scored 40 applications for the Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permits resulting in the 14 highest scoring applicants advancing to the final phase of the permit application process, including submittal of proposed retail site locations; and

WHEREAS, the proposed retail site locations for the 14 storefront retail commercial cannabis business permit applicants show a geographic density, including nearly half of the proposed locations in one City ward and no proposed locations in two other City wards, resulting in the need for further study of the effects of such concentration on furtherance of the stated purpose of the Cannabis Business Activities Ordinance, including but not limited to retail access by residents and/or protection of health and safety of residents from negative impacts; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RMC 5.77.120, the City has reserved the right, prior to 23 permit issuance, to modify, postpone, or cancel any request for applications, at any time 24 without liability, obligation, or commitment to any party, firm, or organization, to the extent 25 permitted under California law, and persons submitting applications assume the risk that all 26 or any part of the cannabis business permit program, or any particular category of permit 27

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potentially authorized under Cannabis Business Activities Ordinance, may be cancelled at any
time prior to permit issuance; and

WHEREAS, on January 7, 2025, the City Council postponed by 90 days, to April 7, 2025, the Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permit application process to study the effects of geographic density, proximity to sensitive receptors and other health and safety concerns, in furtherance of the stated goals of the Cannabis Business Activities Ordinance and the other ordinances referenced herein, including but not limited to retail access by residents and/or protection of health and safety of residents from negative impacts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to extend the postponement of the Storefront
Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permit application process, including all deadlines under
the Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permit Procedure Guidelines and
Application Review Criteria, for an additional 30 days, to May 7, 2025, to allow for possible
modification of Riverside Municipal Code 5.77 and the Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis
Business Permit Procedure Guidelines and Application Review Criteria.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside,
on the basis of the presentation and staff report and the other evidence submitted to the City
Council, as follows:

19 Section 1: That the above recitals are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated as if stated in full.

That, pursuant to Riverside Municipal Code section 5.77.120, the City Section 2: 21 Council hereby extends the postponement of the City of Riverside's evaluation and review of 22 applications for Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permits being evaluated in 23 accord with Resolution No. 24048 by an additional 30 days, to May 7, 2025, for further study 24 and possible action by the City. This postponement shall continue the pause of all deadlines 25 under the Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis Business Permit Procedure Guidelines and 26 Application Review Criteria for up to 30 days. No Storefront Retail Commercial Cannabis 27 Business Permits shall issue during the pendency of this postponement. 28
