B. STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING AND APPROACH

Clean Harbor's plan for supporting any call out work is based upon time tested and proven SOP's. Upon award of a contract, Clean Harbors' representatives will meet with your operations team to review specific needs and areas of concern, as well as to get an understanding of the specific areas and facilities you operate. Clean Harbors representatives will explain the contact procedure for any call out events and will ensure that all personnel understand callout procedures.

Service requests will be initiated based upon your needs. For emergencies, simply call 1-800-OIL-TANK (800-645-8265) and for non-emergency service requests, you can contact your local Account Manager or Customer Service Representative to schedule services. A brief description of each type of response is provided below

NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE ER

"One call does it all."

One call to the EOC at **1.800.OIL.TANK** (1.800.645.8265) from anywhere across North America connects you to Clean Harbors' network of emergency response service centers. With our experience, technical knowledge and vast array of resources, Clean Harbors provides a complete solution, and our customers know they are in good hands.

The typical emergency response team deployed would include the following members:

- Supervisor or Foreman
- Equipment Operator/Driver
- One to Three Clean-up Technicians
- Should additional labor be required due to the size of the spill/project, Clean Harbors is prepared to staff the job accordingly in order to expedite the cleanup

Equipment that may be mobilized initially could include:

- Emergency Response Utility Vehicle (equipped as per Clean Harbors guidelines)
- High Powered Vacuum Unit (Cusco, Guzzler)
- Supervisor/Foreman Pickup Truck
- Additional equipment could include liquid vacuum trucks, rolloff trucks, dump trucks, etc.

Non-emergency

Customers may call either their local Account Manager or Customer Service Representative to request non-emergency services. Clean Harbors prefers five (5) working days to schedule routine services but will work with Customers to schedule services earlier if that is your need. Upon contract award, Clean Harbors will meet with your decision makers to discuss and implement specific communication procedures in order to provide expedited service.

CALL OUT PROCEDURES, REPORTS AND DISPOSAL

For spills and incidents, generally the procedure would be as follows:

1. An authorized representative calls Clean Harbors (CHES) 24 Hour Emergency Spill Response Hotline at **1-800-645-8265**. At a minimum, a customer should be prepared to provide the following information and obtain the following information:
 - ✓ Site contact name and phone number
 - ✓ Company name and incident location
 - ✓ Substance spilled
 - ✓ Quantity of material spilled, and potentially impacted areas is gathered
 - ✓ Spill source
 - ✓ Has spill been contained/stopped?
 - ✓ Has the spill impacted storm drains or other sensitive areas?

This information is vital in determining which Clean Harbors office will be best equipped to service your location.

2. The EOC Duty Operator will use the requested information to start a detail incident report and will plot the incident location using the information provided by the caller on to a mapping program. Clean Harbors EOC uses state of the art mapping software to minimize emergency response time.
3. The Clean Harbors Duty Operator routes the call to the Clean Harbors response center.
4. A conference call is created between the customer, a trained specialist at the local facility, and if needed the EOC operator. If the operator is no longer needed, they then disconnect from the call. If any other correspondence is needed the EOC is staffed 24/7
5. The assigned Clean Harbors Supervisor takes the call and information. An **estimated** time of arrival (ETA) for personnel and equipment to arrive at the incident site will be provided.
6. The necessary trained personnel and response resources will be mobilized as soon as possible to the incident location
7. If necessary, CH Supervisor calls regulatory agency regarding spill or release. CH Supervisor handles any paperwork associated with spill or release with regulatory agency.
8. Once on scene the CHES Supervisor will prepare a Chapter 13 H&S Plan, contact and review H&S issues and cleanup methods with CHES H&S Department. Once CHES personnel and equipment arrive an incident briefing and H&S meeting will be performed outlining the hazards and preferred cleanup methods.
9. The CH Supervisor manages activities of service staff during clean up. CHES personnel will don the appropriate PPE, install caution tape to delineate the exclusion zone, decontamination reduction zone, and support zone. Waste will be containerized and or staged based upon the type and size of the spill response.
10. The CH Supervisor follows up with service staff regarding the completion of the cleanup.

11. Clean Harbors will assist in profiling the spilled material and coordinate its proper transportation and disposal and provide a quote for these additional services.
12. A detailed incident report will accompany any invoices issued to you by Clean Harbors.

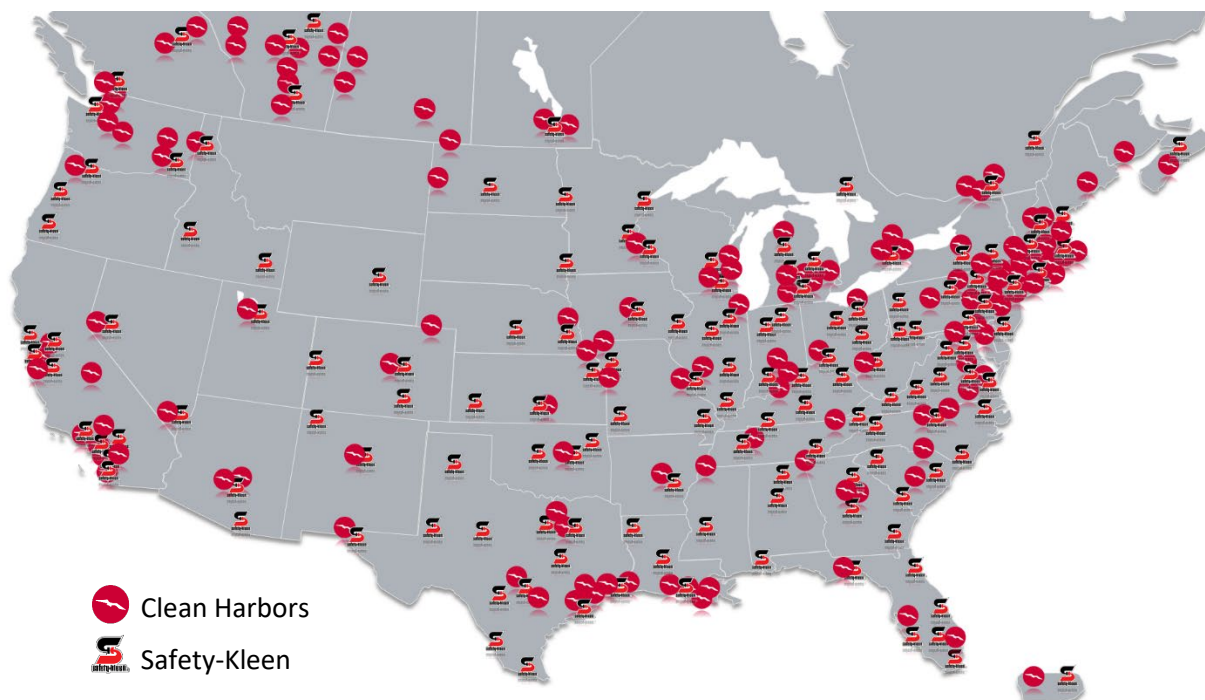
Founded in 1980, Clean Harbors is a publicly traded (CLH) leading provider of environmental, energy and industrial services throughout North America. We are also the largest re-refiner and recycler of used oil in the world and the largest provider of parts cleaning and related environmental services to commercial, industrial and automotive customers in North America.

Our Company consists of two operating segments:

- 1) **Environmental Services** which consists of Technical Services, Field Services, Industrial Services, and Oil, Gas and Lodging lines of business.
 - a) Technical Services provides a broad range of vertically integrated hazardous and non-hazardous material management services. These include collection, packaging, transportation and disposal services, which are offered at Company-owned recycling, incineration, landfill, wastewater, and other treatment facilities.
 - b) Field Services provides a wide variety of environmental cleanup services at customer sites or other locations, on a scheduled or emergency response basis; including tank cleaning, decontamination, remediation and spill cleanup.
 - c) Industrial Services provides turnkey industrial and specialty services to refineries, chemical plants, oil sands facilities, pulp and paper mills, and other industrial facilities. These include high-pressure and chemical cleaning, catalyst handling, decoking, daylighting and hydro excavation, material processing, etc.

D. COMPANY PERSONNEL

Clean Harbors is experienced in providing emergency response and transportation and disposal services. Clean Harbors staff are properly trained and highly experienced at providing all these services.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT TEAM

Clean Harbors' Field Service Center will provide a team of experienced professionals to manage the City's service needs. A dedicated team of professionals consisting of a Field Services Branch Manager, and a Project Manager/ Field Services Specialist will provide the coordinated program management the City is in need of. Together, the team will ensure efficient planning, quality service, cost control, and risk containment. Clean Harbors will be responsible for controlling the quality of work, the work schedule and budget; and for assuring that the specified quality, schedule and budget is achieved.

Clean Harbors Field Services Specialist will have overall project responsibility and will be the primary operational contact for the City. He will oversee planning, provide technical advice, and will act as liaison between the City and Clean Harbors. Our Field Services Specialist will be responsible for appropriating equipment and arranging for services, leading & supervising field operations, ensuring that Health & Safety requirements are adhered to.

Our Field Technicians will perform the waste handling and cleanup services. The Equipment Operators/Driver will operate trucks and other necessary equipment to transport supplies and waste to and from the cleanup sites. The Drivers will often fill Technician roles while onsite if needed.

Clean Harbors Branch Manager is accountable for all projects performed out of the local branch and will provide management oversight for all the services we provide to the City.

The Regional Health & Safety Manager, will provide program Health & Safety oversight, and support H&S Plan development.

Customer satisfaction is a priority for Clean Harbors, your Account Manager, Crystal Avila, will routinely meet with you to discuss performance. Your Account Manager will be your primary point of contact for contract and account management needs.

Pricing Conditions

"Contractor" is hereby defined to mean Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc., along with its affiliates and subsidiaries, including but not limited to Hepaco, LLC and Emergency Response and Training Solutions, LLC.

1. All labor, equipment, materials, and services outlined in this Schedule of Rates will be invoiced at the pricing above unless project item is completed by a subcontractor. Any third-party goods or services utilized by Contractor in the performance of the services shall be invoiced at Contractor's cost plus a markup of twenty percent (20%). Unless otherwise specified, these rates are not valid for response to Infectious Agents/Biologicals. The Schedule of Rates includes the cost of Contractor basic medical monitoring program. Any special medical monitoring required by the Customer or the nature of the work will be added to the project scope and the Customer will be invoiced at cost plus the markup listed above.
2. Lodging and subsistence for Contractor personnel and our subcontractors in the field are included in a per diem charge per person per day when working more than 30 miles from the employee's normal operations center and when overnight accommodations are required. The rate is outlined in the labor section of this document. When overnight accommodations are not required but work exceeds 12 hours, a \$50.00 charge per day per person may apply to cover meals and incidentals.
3. At its sole discretion, Contractor will determine the level of protection required for each project. Level A, B, C or D personal protection and safety packages will be invoiced at the rates shown in the Schedule of Rates.
4. Contractor's personnel and equipment will be charged portal-to-portal (mobilization and demobilization included). Services provided prior, during and/or subsequent to actual project site activities will also be charged at the Hourly Rate. This may include time required to mobilize, service, repair, coordinate, administer, demobilize, and restock all vehicles and equipment used in performance of the work (whether performed on or off site), but is not limited to, time taken by personnel to decontaminate and re-don protective clothing and equipment that is billed as part of the project.
5. Contractor's normal employee workday is 7:00 am to 3:30 pm, Monday through Friday. Other work hours must be agreed to in writing in advance. No more than eight (8) hours of straight time will be billed for one person for one day. All time will be based upon a 24-hour day.
6. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours in the normal workday, as described above, as well as all hours worked all day Saturday are considered overtime and will be billed at 1.5 times the applicable straight time rate for all billable personnel.
7. Sunday and Holidays are considered premium time and will be billed at 2.0 times the applicable straight time rate for all billable personnel. Holidays are the legally observed United States Federal Holidays plus the day after Thanksgiving. When local laws or regulations recognize additional holidays or when local laws or regulations define premium hours in excess of this definition, Contractor will invoice in accordance with local laws or regulations.
8. All projects are subject to a minimum four (4) hour response charge or \$3500.00 minimum charge, whichever is greater. Minimum charges do not apply to Transportation and Disposal.
9. Charges for Safety Plans are assessed on all projects. In some instances, a Site Safety Officer charge will apply per hour to create and administer the Safety Plan.
10. Contractor assigns a Project Manager to each project. Contractor's Project Managers are experienced professionals who are responsible for directing Contractor field supervisors, obligating company resources to a project, and providing technical guidance to projects. Customers are billed for the time spent and expenses incurred by the Project Managers for periodic site visits, Customer-requested meetings, and other activities deemed necessary to assure a properly run project. Additional Project Managers or supervisory personnel may be assigned as deemed necessary by Contractor.
11. A variable Energy and Security Recovery Fee (that fluctuates with the applicable national average diesel price), will be applied to the total invoice, excluding sales tax. For more information regarding our recovery fee calculation please go to: www.cleanharbors.com/recoveryfee.

The Customer acknowledges that the estimated cost is based on a preliminary on-site appraisal by the Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc. ("Clean Harbors") field representative and that the amount invoiced by Clean Harbors will be based on labor and materials actually expended in performing the Scope of Work. Any changes in the Scope of Work will be billed in addition to the estimated cost specified above. Customer hereby assigns to Clean Harbors all rights to any insurance payments that Customer may be entitled to receive to pay for the Services provided under this Field Services Agreement and hereby authorizes its insurance company or agent to pay Clean Harbors directly. Customer agrees that all charges that are not paid to Clean Harbors by its insurance company will be paid by the Customer.

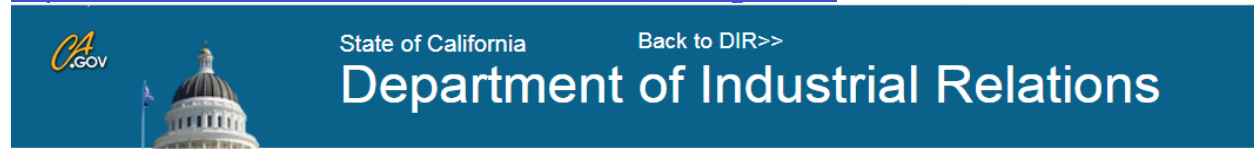
