SUBJECT: HOUSING AUTHORITY'S PROJECTS UPDATE

ISSUE:

Receive and file the update on Housing Authority's projects.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Committee receive and file the update on Housing Authority's projects.

BACKGROUND:

At the request of the Housing & Homelessness Committee, the Housing Authority has a standing item on the agenda under Communications to provide monthly updates on projects.

DISCUSSION:

The Housing Authority currently has 476 affordable housing units in the development pipeline, including 169 permanent supportive housing units aimed at serving individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

In addition, the City has secured:

- Eleven (11) affordable housing units through the Density Bonus Law, and
- Ten (10) affordable housing units approved under the California Housing Crisis Act of 2019 (replacement requirement).

These additional units bring the total number of affordable housing units in the development pipeline to 497.

A detailed status update for each project is included in Attachment A.

Housing Authority staff will continue to monitor the progress of all pipeline projects and will provide the Committee with monthly updates to ensure transparency and maintain oversight of the City's affordable housing development efforts.
