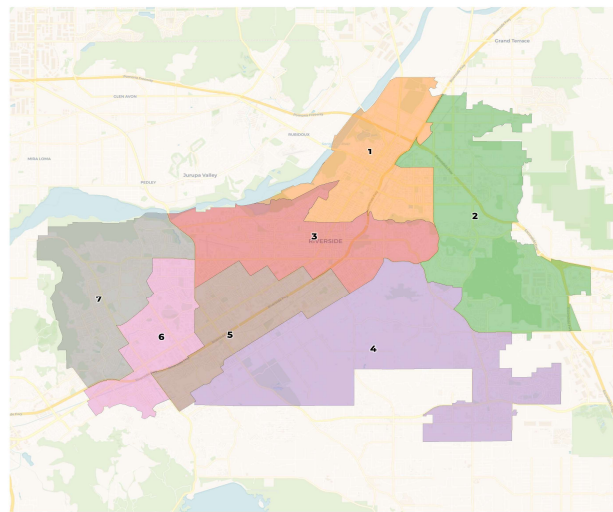

OLD MAP VERSUS NEW MAP

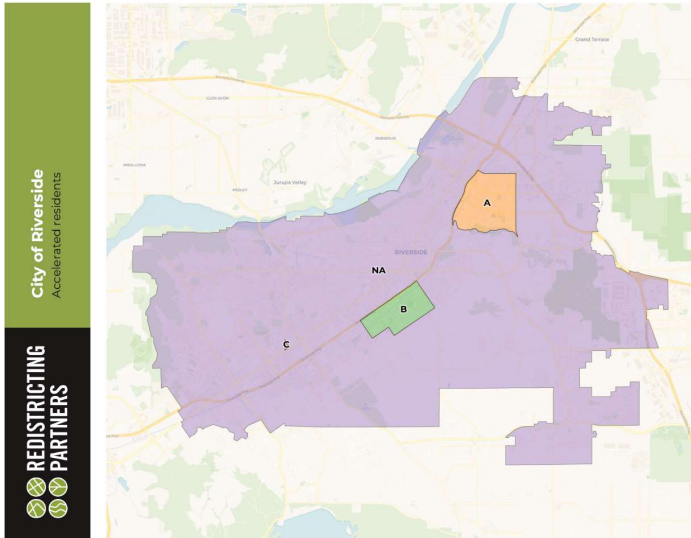

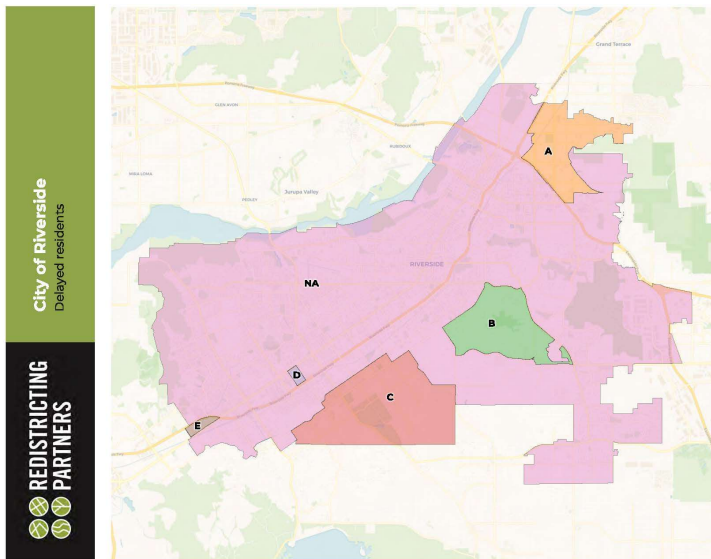

EXAMPLE: DEFERRED VOTER

Person A resides in the Greenbelt and prior to redistricting was part of Ward 5. After redistricting, Person A is now in Ward 4. Person A was last eligible to vote for Council in June 2019 for a term that ended March 2024. March 2024 was the first election after redistricting. Person A was not eligible to vote in the Ward 5 election. Person A will next be eligible to vote for Council in June 2026 in the Ward 4 election.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

City Charter section 802 requires each Ward to have a representative on each board and commission.

The Charter is silent as to what happens when a board or commission member is redistricted to a new Ward.

EXAMPLE: BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Person A resides in the Greenbelt and prior to redistricting was in Ward 5. After redistricting, that person now resides in Ward 4. Person A was appointed prior to the 2024 redistricting to fill the Ward 5 seat on a board, with a term ending in 2025. Person A seeks reappointment for a second term. Person A was not eligible to vote in the March 2024 general election for Ward 5. Person A will not vote in Ward 4 until June 2026.
