Residents of the Eastside community, members of the Bordwell Park Advisory, and both Councilmembers Falcone and Cervantes request that the new gymnasium at Bordwell Park be named after Adrian "Dell" Roberts due to his lifelong commitment to serving our community.

Dell Roberts has been a leader in the Eastside for over six decades. His service to the city of Riverside includes 38 years at the Riverside Unified School District as a football coach, campus supervisor, and assistant principal in charge of discipline at Poly High School from 1965-1989, and as assistant administrator in charge of discipline and campus security for the district from 1989 until his retirement in 2003.

He continues to be a positive influence in the neighborhood through his impactful work with his nonprofit, The Adrian Dell & Carmen Roberts Foundation (ADCR Foundation). Every year the ADCR Foundation hosts events like their annual backpack giveaway, the Black History Month parade and expo, and the Empowering Young Women conference. Dell continues to advocate for Bordwell Park and the surrounding community serving as the president of the Bordwell Park Advisory group presently.
