Mission

1. Provide feedback on progress updates of Museum of Riverside Strategic Plan

2. Volunteer to support Museum of Riverside programs and events

At each meeting, the Museum of Riverside Board will receive information about upcoming programs and events and how Museum of Riverside Board members can support Museum of Riverside programs and events.

3. Approve accessions and deaccessions to Museum collections

The Museum of Riverside Board will decide whether to recommend accession or deaccession of objects to/from Museum collections to City Council.

4. Receive training on the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law

The Museum of Riverside Board will receive training on the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law. The training will be provided by the City Attorney's Office.

5. Select date and time for special meeting due to winter holidays

The Museum of Riverside Board will determine the date and time for a Special Meeting because the regularly scheduled Museum of Riverside Board meetings conflict with winter holidays.

6. Review the City of Riverside's Code of Ethics and Conduct

The Museum of Riverside Board will provide feedback and suggestions to the City Clerk regarding proposed changes to the Code of Ethics and Conduct.

7. Elect Museum of Riverside Board Officers

The Museum of Riverside Board will elect Chair and Vice Chair for a one-year term.

8. Review the Museum Department's budget

The Museum of Riverside Board will have the opportunity to provide feedback regarding the Museum Department's budget.
