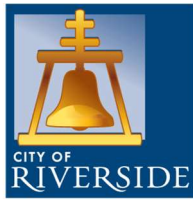

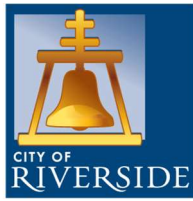
WORKSHOP

SENATE BILL 707 UPDATE

The City Council received and ordered filed a presentation on the 2026 updates to the Brown Act pursuant to Senate Bill 707.

CONSENT CALENDAR

It was moved by Councilmember Hernandez and seconded by Councilmember Mill to approve the Consent Calendar as presented affirming the actions appropriate to each item except (1) item regarding Bid 8216 for the Gage Canel Multi-Purpose Recreational Trail project removed from the Consent Calendar for separate discussion;



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(2) Councilmember Mill voting no on adoption of the ordinance amending Chater 3.30; and (3) Councilmember Mill abstained from item regarding levy of special taxes during Fiscal Year 2026-27 within various Community Facilities Districts. The motion carried with Councilmember Hemenway absent.

CITY MANAGER PRO TEMPORE APPOINTMENTS

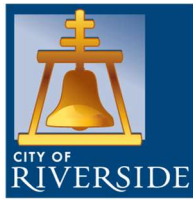
The City Council confirmed the appointment of (1) Assistant City Manager, Edward Enriquez, as City Manager Pro Tempore; (2) Assistant City Manager, Kris Martinez, as City Manager Pro Tempore; and (3) Assistant City Manager, Gil Hernandez, as City Manager Pro Tempore.

INTERIM FINANCE DIRECTOR APPOINTMENT

The City Council appointed the Interim Finance Director as Chief Financial Officer for the sole purpose of calling to order the first meeting of the Inland California Community Capital Fund, the City's incorporated Community Development Entity required for submission of an application to the federal New Markets Tax Credits Program.

REVISED SCHEDULE OF PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT - MIXED-USE STUDENT HOUSING PROJECT - 3911 UNIVERSITY/3775 FAIRMOUNT

The City Council (1) approved the revised Schedule of Performance within the Agreement for the sale and development of City-owned vacant land located at 3911 University Avenue and 3775 Fairmount Boulevard APN 214-252-019 and 213-261-029, formerly the Downtown Terminal Property, for development of a mixed-use student housing project; (2) approved the assignment of all rights and obligations under the Agreement from Pelican Communities, LLC., to Overland Pelican Riverside, LLC., consistent with the developer's established joint-venture structure; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the First Amendment including making minor and non-substantive revisions, and to execute all documents necessary to complete the transaction.



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EXEMPT SURPLUS DECLARATION OF CITY OWNED PARCEL - 5188 VICTORIA/ELSINORE - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution to declare as exempt surplus City-owned land, approximately 1,032 square feet as street frontage surplus property, near Victoria Avenue and Elsinore Road (Property); (2) authorized the conveyance of fee simple Property to the adjacent owner at 5188 Victoria Avenue as street frontage area, pursuant to Assembly Bill 1486 and in accordance with the City's Administrative Manual 08.003.00 for the Disposition and Sale of City-owned Real Property; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute any documents necessary to effectuate this transaction.

Whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 24392 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, declaring as exempt surplus a City-owned parcel with approximately 1,032 square feet, located near Victoria Avenue and Elsinore Road, pursuant to Assembly Bill 1486, was presented and adopted.

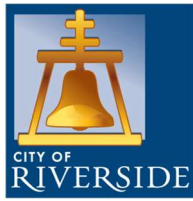
The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Title 16 Buildings and Construction and Title 19 Zoning of the Riverside Municipal Code.

RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT - CHAPTER 3.30 - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an ordinance amending the Riverside Municipal Code Chapter 3.30 Section 3.30.030 - Schedule of Regulation, Products and Services, adding two categories and eight additional fees. Councilmember Mill voted no.

The City Council (1) approved the Professional Consultant Services Agreement from Request for Proposal 2539 with Keenan & Associates, Torrance, for Property and Casualty Insurance Broker and Risk Consulting Services for the term of three years with an option to extend for two additional one-year terms not to exceed five years, in the amount of \$57,500 for the first year and \$60,000 per year for years two and three for a total agreement amount of \$177,500; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Agreement with Keenan & Associates including making minor and non-substantive changes, including term extensions up to 2 additional one-year terms, subject to the availability of budgeted funds.



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REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL 2522 AGREEMENT - TRANSPORTATION AND REMOVAL OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The City Council (1) approved a Professional Consultant Services Agreement from Request for Proposal 2522 with Clean Harbors Environmental, Highland, for transportation and removal of hazardous materials for the term of three years ending on June 30, 2029, for \$3,000,000 in the amount of \$1,000,000 annually plus 10 percent change order authority in the amount of \$300,000 for a total agreement amount of \$3,300,000; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Agreement with Clean Harbors Environmental, including making minor and non-substantive changes, including extensions up to two additional one-year terms, subject to the availability of budgeted funds.

REQUEST FOR BID 8239 AGREEMENT - EMERGENCY VEHICLE COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT

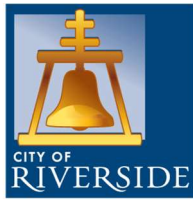
The City Council (1) awarded a Services Agreement from Request for Bid 8239 with Dana Safety Supply, Inc., Rancho Cucamonga, for the supply of goods and labor for the installation of radios, emergency response lighting, siren, and emergency vehicle communications equipment on six new 2025 Ford Expedition Sport Utility Vehicles for one year upon execution of the Agreement with an option to extend for one additional six-month terms not to exceed 1.5 years, in the amount of \$225,592.31; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Services Agreement with Dana Safety Supply, Inc., including making minor and non-substantive changes, including term extensions up to one additional six-month term, subject to the availability of budgeted funds.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT) STUDENT RIDE-ALONG PROGRAM

The City Council (1) approved a Memorandum of Understanding with the Riverside County Superintendent of Schools for an EMT Student Ride-Along Program with the Fire Department for a five-year term; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the MOU Agreement with the Riverside County Superintendent of Schools.

RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT - CHAPTER 5.66 - AMBULANCE SERVICES - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Chapter 5.66 of the Riverside Municipal Code regarding ambulances.

ANNUAL PURCHASE ORDERS - FLEET AUTOMOTIVE PARTS AND SUPPLIES

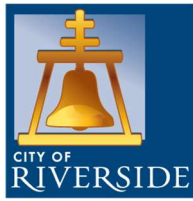
The City Council (1) approved annual purchase orders with PAI Holdco, Inc., dba Parts Authority, LLC., under Sourcwell Contract No. 080124-PAH, and Elliott Auto Supply Co., Inc., dba Factory Motor Parts (FMP) Co., under Axia Cooperative Contract 226051-01, for the purchase of fleet automotive parts and related supplies, in a combined total amount not to exceed \$500,000, for a term of one year from July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute any purchase orders, agreements, and other documents, including making any minor and non-substantive changes.

ANNUAL PURCHASE ORDERS - FLEET GOODYEAR TIRES AND SERVICES

The City Council (1) approved annual purchase orders for the purchase of tires and related services with Parkhouse Tire, Inc., under NASPO Contract 24157 for Continental Tire the Americas, LLC., NASPO Contract 24158 for Bridgestone Americas Tire Operation, LLC., and NASPO Contract 24156 for Michelin North America, Inc., and with Daniels Tire Service under Sourcwell Contract 051525-GTC for Goodyear tires, in a combined total amount not to exceed \$600,000, for a one-year term from July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute any purchase orders, agreements, and other documents, including making any minor and non-substantive changes.

AMENDMENT AGREEMENT - CUSTODIAL SERVICES - VARIOUS CITY FACILITIES

The City Council (1) approved the Seventh Amendment to the Services Agreement for Annual Custodial Services at Multiple City Facilities with Universal Building Maintenance, LLC., dba Allied Universal Janitorial Services, to extend the term through September 30, 2026, and increase compensation in the amount of \$235,043.08; (2) ratified Emergency Purchase Order with Universal Building Maintenance, LLC., in the amount of \$39,173.85 for a two-week service period for retroactive approval; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Seventh Amendment, including making minor and non-substantive changes.



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SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT - HOMELESS HOUSING, ASSISTANCE AND PREVENTION PROGRAM ROUND 2, 3, AND 4 - SHELTER BEDS AND OPERATING COSTS

The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to the Subrecipient Agreement for the Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention Program Round 2, 3, and 4 with Path of Life Ministries to extend the original Agreement term by one additional year through June 30, 2027, and to increase the Agreement amount by \$362,900 for an updated total agreement amount of \$2,321,400; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the First Amendment with Path of Life Ministries including making minor and non-substantive changes.

OFFICE SPACE - MISSION SQUARE OFFICE BUILDING - 3750 UNIVERSITY

The City Council approved the usage of office space by the Museum Department for a term not-to-exceed three years for approximately 2,534 square feet of rentable space in the Mission Square Office Building located at 3750 University Avenue, Suite 230, in the amount of \$276,408.

SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION AGENCY SAFETY PLAN

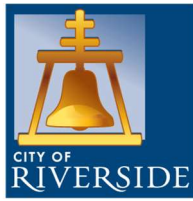
The City Council approved the Special Transportation Agency Safety Plan as required under the Federal Transit Administration Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan Final Rule (49 CFR Part 673).

SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION DIVISION'S SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN - FISCAL YEARS 2026- 2027/2028-2029 - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) adopted the Special Transportation Division's Short Range Transit Plan for Fiscal Years 2026-2027 - 2028-2029; (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to submit to Riverside County Transportation Commission the Transportation Development Act, State of Good Repair, and State Transit Assistance claim forms and Transportation Development Act Standard Assurances Form for Fiscal Year 2026-2027; and (3) authorized the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record an increase in revenue in the amount of \$7,526,325, and appropriate the amount of \$7,526,325 to various accounts in the Special Transportation Fund as outlined in the report to align the Special Transportation City Council adopted budget with the Riverside County Transportation Commission's approved funding levels on the Short Range Transit Plan.

STATE OF CALIFORNIA OFFICE - TRAFFIC SAFETY SELECTIVE TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM GRANT - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

The City Council (1) approved the acceptance of the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program funding from the State of California, Office of Traffic Safety in the amount of



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\$412,000; (2) approved the acceptance of the Child Passenger Safety Program funding from the State of California, Office of Traffic Safety in the amount of \$25,000; (3) approved the acceptance of the Motorcycle Safety Program funding from the State of California, Office of Traffic Safety in the amount of \$24,000; (4) authorized the Chief Financial Officer, or designee, to record supplemental appropriations and related revenues in the amount of the grant awards in the Grants and Restricted Programs Fund, Selective Traffic Enforcement Program, Child Passenger Safety Program, and Motorcycle Safety Program revenue and expenditure accounts for each award; and (5) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute all grant documents with the State of California, Office of Traffic Safety, including making minor and non-substantive changes.
