DISCUSSION

Raising the City Manager's Authority Limit to \$50,000

- Brings it in line with current statutory limits
- Improves the City's ability to resolve claims more efficiently
 - Reduces the number of lower-value settlements requiring City Council Approval
 - · Saving staff time
 - Quicker resolution of claims
