- Limited to determining General Plan consistency



February - March

Finance Department requests annual review of Capital Improvement Program (CIP)



April - May

Planning Commission reviews for General Plan 2025 consistency



June

City Council reviews FY budget alongside



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GENERAL PLAN CONSISTENCY

- May 11, 2023: Planning Commission reviewed 22 projects and determined General Plan 2025 consistency of the FY 2023/2024 CIP
- Current Review: FY 2024-2026 CIP
 - 33 new projects previously not considered
 - Anticipated to be considered by City Council in June 2024

- **REPORT** to the City Council that the capital improvement projects added for FY 2024-2026 are consistent with the City's General Plan 2025.
