BACKGROUND

On January 17, 2023, the City Council adopted a Flag Policy.

- The Flag Policy provides guidelines pertaining to commemorative flags which identify with a specific date, historical event, cause, or group of people.
- At this same meeting, staff was directed to seek input from the Human Relations Commission regarding commemorative flags.

BACKGROUND

On February 23, 2023, the Human Relations Commission (HRC) received a presentation and provided input on suggested commemorative flags for display at City facilities.

HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION (HRC)

The Human Relations Commission expressed support for the following dates, groups and causes:

- Dr. Martin Luther King Day* (third Monday in January)
- International Holocaust Remembrance Day (January 27)
- Black History Month (February)
- Women's History Month* or Women's Suffrage Victory (March)
- Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month* (May)
- LGBTQ Pride Month (June)

* Note: There is no established or commonly recognized commemorative flag available.



HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION (HRC)

- Juneteenth (June 19)
- Latino/a Heritage Month*
- Indigenous Peoples Day* (October) or Native American Heritage Month* (November)

*Note: There is no established or commonly recognized commemorative flag available.

HRC SUGGESTIONS



Where there is no established or commonly recognized commemorative flag available (Asian American/Pacific Islander Heritage Month, Latino/a Heritage Month, Indigenous Peoples Day and Native American Heritage Month), engage those communities to participate in a community art project to design that flag.
- 2. Invite the community to participate in any commemorative flag raising ceremonies.
